# Transforming Lives Transforming Church

When was the last time you met someone that didn't feel they were too busy? When was the last time you didn't feel overtired? When was the last time your whole family was together for more than a tenminute conversation? When was the last time you had a real conversation with your neighbors about something other than the weather or the price of gas? When was the last time you prayed for your brothers and sisters in Christ at Grace by name simply because they are part of your church family? When was the last time something that was said on Sunday morning made a tangible difference in the way you live your life on Tuesday? When was the last time the church was more than a building you show up in once a week or once or twice a month? When was the last time you made a commitment to change your life because you knew God wanted you to make the change?

If you can't remember the last time several of these things happened, then perhaps it is time we did a few things differently with our time as a faith community. Our church has tons of opportunities for you to be involved in service, Bible study, worship, music, fellowship events, and the list goes on and on. Still there is a point at which we all have to say, I can only do so much, I can only retain so many messages, I can only... It's not that the things we are doing are not great, they simply are not connected and somewhere along the way we all tend to get lost in the barrage of messages, so that finally we end up with very little practical difference in our daily lives. I for one would like to begin to change that trend. I believe that God's desire for us as a church family is that we would learn to love him, love one another, and serve our neighbors. Sounds pretty simple, doesn't it? Of course, there's about a billion ways to do that. So, rather than take on the billion, perhaps we could simply commit together to one simple step that would help us transform lives as together we transform church.

That is the premise behind a new initiative you will be hearing a lot about in the weeks and months to come called LifeGroups. Do not misunderstand me, this is not another program. This is not going to be another event that you can choose to attend or not attend. LifeGroups are the church, living and moving in your neighborhood supporting you in prayer, helping you to live out the message of the Gospel, and connecting you deeply with other brothers and sisters in Christ through fellowship. I hope that within two years every person that attends Grace will be connected to a LifeGroup that meets within their neighborhood every month and helps every person in our church family learn to love God, love one another, and serve their neighbor in simple but life-changing ways.

As a first step, I invite everyone to fill out the simple form on page 3 of this newsletter so that we can begin to identify neighborhoods, discern needs, and discover potential leaders.

### PERSONNEL BOARD-OFFICE SECRETARY OPENING

dads welcome the help that comes from family and friends.



She is an awesome teacher! We are currently with her from 4 to 6 each afternoon. The time will probably change again when the Bible Institute classes begin in a few weeks.



Stuart and Kearstin are still working very hard at their home schooling. The DVD curriculum has been a real blessing. Tina and I are still very involved in the studying and testing, but we are freed up from most of the teaching. They have been great about doing all their schooling and the Spanish classes, and helping out in other areas, like summer camps.

Continue to pray for the kids and us as we work on the language, and the differences in culture and customs. At times we think we are doing pretty good, and other days... well... some days are pretty tough. But God is ever faithful, and we are learning He is totally sufficient.
