Didn't I Write This Already?

For in [Christ Jesus] all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile himself to all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross. Colossians 1:19-20

Where did I put my keys?
Or for that matter, where did I park my car?

What did I come in this room for? What's your name again?

Did I let Polo back in the house or is he outside in the rain? Did I remember to turn off the coffee pot or is my house on fire?

What was the question? I forgot.

It seems as we grow older, it's easier to forget. Long term vs. short term memory become a fact of daily life. We can remember detail for detail something that happened years ago, but, for the life of us, can't remember what we had for lunch. (Or did I even have lunch?)

Yes, we forget a lot of things. God forgets, too. But that's a good thing—a blessed thing.

God forgets our sins! All of them! In Psalm 103, we read: "God does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities...as far as the east is from the west; so far he removes our transgressions from us."

St. John reminds us in his first letter, when we confess our sins God forgives us and cleanses us from all unrighteousness. By the blood of his beloved sin, God washes away our sins—down the drain and forgotten.

God forgets our sins; but he never, ever forgets us. This is another theme of Scripture.

Referring to the passage at the top of this page, specifically God's pleasure in reconciling to himself all things, the renowned theologian and teacher (one of my all-time favorites) Jurgen Moltmann writes: "To put it simply: God forgets nothing that he has created. Nothing is lost to him. He will remember all. He will restore all."

How good and how gracious is our God! He forgets to our eternal benefit. He remembers, remember us all, to his eternal glory. Amen.

Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

On Good Friday, some churches portray the "Stations of the Cross." What is this?

The **Stations of the Cross** or **Way of the Cross** is the depiction of the "Passion of Jesus" or the final hours leading up to his death on the cross and burial. The tradition as a service of devotion began with St. Francis of Assisi and soon extended throughout the Roman Catholic Church in the medieval era. It is also observed in the Anglican/Episcopalian and Lutheran churches, though at a much lesser frequency.

The ritual may be done at any time, but is most commonly done during the Season of Lent, especially on Good Friday. Some churches or a collection of congregations often choose to re-enact the station in a church setting or on the streets of the community.

The Scriptural Stations of the Cross

- 1. Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane,
- 2. Jesus is betrayed by Judas and arrested,
- 3. Jesus is condemned by the Sanhedrin,
- 4. Jesus is denied by Peter,
- 5. Jesus is judged by Pilate,
- 6. Jesus is scourged and crowned with thorns,
- 7. Jesus takes up His cross,

- 8. Jesus is helped by Simon of Cyrene,
- 9. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem
- 10. Jesus is crucified,
- 11. Jesus promises Paradise to a repentant thief,
- 12. Jesus entrusts Mary and John to each other,
- 13. Jesus dies on the cross.
- 14. Jesus is laid in the tomb.



IVESTING IN OUR Future... Nurturing Our Voulle

The March 2011 Planning Council approved an initiative to explore the hiring of a part-time Youth and Family Ministries Coordinator. Council agreed the position is needed to encourage and enhance youth and family participation in spiritual, social and service programs. Members noted that Grace is in good financial shape and giving trends indicate this would be an opportune time to examine the possibilities this position would offer children of all ages.

Pastor Rice presented proposal. After careful and helpful discussion, it was approved unanimously as follows.

Youth and Family Ministries Coordinator: This part-time position (10-15 hours per week) would plan, communicate and implement activities for children all ages and their families. The person would also be available to teach a junior or senior high Sunday School class.

Youth Ministry Board would develop job description. This board would oversee, evaluate and supervise position.

Personnel Board would approve job description and develop compensation package to be approved by Planning Council. This board would also interview candidates and present its selection to Planning Council for approval.

Endowment Committee will be asked to approve a one-time gift of \$3000.00 to provide initial funding for the ministry/position.

Beatitude Attitudes

Spring 2011 Bible Study May 4-June 8 Wednesdays at 6:45-8:00 p.m. Luther Hall

The Beatitudes (Matthew 5:1-12) are Jesus' introduction to his Sermon on the Mount and his public teaching ministry. The words establish Jesus' basic ethical principles for discipleship and everyday Christian living.

The Beatitudes are written in two "stanzas." The first stanza identifies persons in great need of God's love and grace. The second stanza names those God calls to minister to our neighbors in need. All of us, at some time or another, have found ourselves in both groups.

Though the Beatitudes are comprised of only a few verses in Scripture, they are rich with meaning, significance and application. As we explore these words of Jesus, we can expect a closer look at our lives and a deeper understanding of those around us. By God's grace, we can develop Beatitude Attitudes to God's glory and the benefit of our neighbors in Christ.



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In February, we distributed 62 bags, and have already distributed 39 in March. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.
