You Leave Me Breathless

Now when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way [Jesus] breathed his last, he said, "Truly this man was God's Son!" Mark 15:39

What's wrong with this headline? **Funeral Home Hires Respiratory Therapist.** OK. That's not the actual headline. But, it should be.

According to a March 4, 2012 article in the local **Times-Reporter**, a funeral home in Coshocton hired a respiratory therapist. Her official position will be office manager. Yet, I cannot help wondering why hire a woman to do largely clerical work who has extensive training and experience helping people breathe. This seems highly unusual and, too me, ironically hilarious.

My first thought was, "Surely the funeral home is not picking up its 'clients' before they've expired and having this woman work on them." Imagine the surprise and amazement of the supposedly deceased's family to discover their loved one resuscitated. Now that would be eerie...and sick.

When I shared the article with others, they too found it weirdly amusing. One person remarked, "Maybe she was really bad at her job and this is where her patients ended up anyway." If so, I just hope she didn't get any kickbacks.

Whether this woman was an excellent respiratory therapist, or not, would have made no difference on that first Good Friday. When Jesus breathed his last and died on the cross, he was really and truly dead as dead can be. No earthly power could have revived him--none whatsoever.

Only Jesus' Father, our Heavenly Father, could resuscitate him. So on the third day, God the Father sent the Holy Spirit to breathe the breath of life into Jesus' lifeless body and raised him from the grave. It was an unearthly, supernatural and divine act of salvation. Jesus lives so that we, too, might live forever with him.

There were those at the time, and still are, who could not believe this had happened. Dismissing God's divine intervention, they search for another explanation. Number One on the list: "The disciples must have stolen Jesus' body and made up this resurrection story." (See Matthew 28:11-15)

St. Paul rebuts this claim in I Corinthians 15, writing, "...if Christ has not been raised from the dead, then our proclamation is in vain and your faith has been in vain." Would the apostles have given their lives for a hoax? Could they all get their stories straight and keep them straight? Would they die for a lie? Is our faith a sham? If so, then we are but dust and to dust we shall return and no more than that.

Ahhh. Now take a deep breath. The truth is Jesus lives! The breath that the Holy Spirit breathed into Jesus, the Holy Spirit will breathe into us. We, too, will be raised to live forever with Jesus in Paradise. That's the wonder, the glory and the promise of Easter. And, that can cause us to be utterly amazed and even leave us breathless. Amen.

Search, though you may, you will find no Lassie, Rin Tin Tin, Benji or Polo in the Bible. Neither will you find kitty cats making themselves at home with ancient Jewish families. There are no references to pets in the Bible.


Dogs were considered scavengers and therefore unclean. They had a reputation of eating garbage, scraps and the torn and ravaged remains of other animals. In Jewish folklore, dogs were said to uncover the graves of the dead and to eat their flesh. To include such an animal as a household pet would contaminate the dwelling and its inhabitants. Though some canines were kept as herders and guard dogs, they had no place inside the home.

The Jews had further reason to not include a dog as a family pet. In Egypt, dogs were often deified in direct violation of their worship of the One True God. For instance, *Anubis* was a dog-headed god who protected the dead in the afterlife and determined their worthiness for entry into the underworld.

For all intents and purposes, the two-fold preclusion goes for cats. In ancient Egypt, cats openly prowled the palaces and temples keeping the area free of rodents and other vermin. In Egyptian mythology, the cat goddess Bastet was the defender and protector of the Pharaoh.

On a lighter note...What's the difference between dog theology and cat theology?





GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In February, we distributed 77 bags, and have already distributed 83 in March. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

PERSONAL CARE KITS AND SCHOOL KITS

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Personal Care Kits

1 light weight bath towel (dark color)
2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb
1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file

School Kits

- 4 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11"; do not include loose leaf paper
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 "long
 - 5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- 12 sheets of construction paper in assorted colors

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons,

5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.
