He's Back!

...Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁴and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁵and that he appeared to Cephas (Peter), then to the twelve. ⁶Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. ²Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. I Corinthians 15:3-7

I have had several requests for a story I used for a sermon illustration on Easter Sunday 2012. I figure one of the best ways to honor those inquiries is to print a condensed version below. (Of course, I think it is a story better told than read, but here it is.)

Mark was about four years old when his pet lizard died. Since it was her grandson's first brush with death, Grandma suggested that Mark and his older brother Matthew hold a "funeral" for the lizard. Plus, she hoped, a funeral would be an opportune "teaching moment" and help bring "closure" to his loss.

Mark had never been to a funeral before, so he asked, "Grandma, what's a funeral? What are we supposed to do?" She explained as simply as possible, "A funeral is a ceremony where you say a prayer, sing a song, and bury your loved one."

The boys thought having a funeral for their pet lizard was a great idea. Grandma went to her closet and provided a shoe box for the lizard's coffin. She then marked out a burial place in her backyard.

The family procession started from the back porch and made its way to the freshly dug burial plot. Taking the lead, the older brother Matthew said a solemn prayer. Then he turned and asked little Mark if he wouldn't like to sing a song. With tears in his eyes, Mark clasped his hands, bowed his head, and belted out *Hit the Road, Jack! And don't you come back no more, no more, no more, no more, no more. Hit the road, Jack. And don't you come back no more.* "*

That's very close to what Pilate, Herod, the Scribes, Pharisees, Sadducees, Caiaphas, Ananias and everyone else who had plotted the death of Jesus may have been singing on that first Good Friday. It was their most fervent wish. "Hit the road **Jesus** and don't you come back no more, no more, no more, no more. Hit the road **Jesus** and don't you come back no more." Jesus was dead, gone and buried. They wouldn't have to put up with him any longer.

Imagine their surprise and great dismay when they learned, "He's back!" Our Good News of Easter, "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!" was bad news to them. Jesus came back, risen from the dead, so that we might have eternal life in his name.

What is more, he is coming back again. As Jesus ascended into heaven, angels appeared to the disciples saying, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up towards heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come again in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." (Acts 1:11)

Before his death and resurrection, before he left them, Jesus told his disciples, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe* in God, believe also in me. ²In my Father's house there are many dwelling-places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?* ³And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also."

Back again? Yes, sooner or later, he's back! On a day more splendid than any earthly Easter, Jesus comes back and we shall see him and live with him in unimaginable and unfathomable glory forever. Amen.

Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

I remember hearing a story about Jesus and the dogwood tree. I also remember it had something to do with Easter. What is that legend?

Legend says Jesus was crucified on the wood of a dogwood tree. Of course, the Bible does not state what kind of wood was used for the cross. No Roman or Jewish history gives a clue, either.

There are several sources for this legend and all are very similar. Here is the most common rendition. Remember, it is from folklore, not Scripture.

At the time of Crucifixion the dogwood had been the size of the oak and other forest trees. So firm and strong was the tree that it was chosen as the timber for the cross. To be used thus for such a cruel purpose greatly distressed the tree, and Jesus nailed upon it, sensed this.

In His gentle pity for all sorrow and suffering Jesus said to the tree: "Because of your regret and pity for My suffering, never again shall the dogwood tree grow large enough to be used as a cross. Henceforth it shall be slender and bent and twisted and its blossoms shall be in the form of a cross--two long and two short petals. And in the center of the outer edge of each petal there will be nail prints, brown with rust and stained with red, and in the center of the flower will be a crown of thorns, and all who see it will remember."



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In February, we distributed 112 bags, and have already distributed 85 in March. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

PERSONAL CARE KITS AND SCHOOL KITS

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Personal Care Kits

1 light weight bath towel (dark color) 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file

School Kits

4 - 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11"; do not include loose leaf paper

1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 "long

5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons, 5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.


