# Holy Hoopla!

For there is one body and one Spirit, just as you have been called to one glorious hope for the future. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all, in all, and living through all. Ephesians 4:4-6

A modern Holy War is about to commence in Columbus. The battlefield is the Jerome Schottenstein Center at The Ohio State University. To the victor goes the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA) Division III Basketball Championship.

The coaching generals have plotted their strategies. Team captains have inspired the troops. The contenders are all uniformed in their tournament regalia and armed with 3-point, 2-point and foul shots. No weapon or ploy will go unused in the quest for victory.

Combat begins at noon Thursday when the Roman Catholics of Cincinnati Purcell Marian taken on the Canal Winchester Harvest Prep Anabaptists. (In Division I, three Vatican sponsored regiments seek to seize the title against a lone sectarian foe.)

The same thing, though to a lesser degree and to quieter complaint happens in the NCAA. (By the way, do you have your brackets done? How are your doing? Busted?) The reigning National Champions are Roman Catholics from Villanova. The Pope's boys have a good chance to repeat with a strong, Number One seed Gonzaga team. The other top-most contenders include Duke's Methodist-Quakers (Huh? How does that work?) and the impious heathen from Virginia and North Carolina.

Whoever prevails, it will all be over by Easter! This is the day all Christians come together, singing and shouting with one voice, **"He is risen! He is risen, indeed!"** 

This is the day all denominational differences are set aside. This is the day all past division and dissent is forgotten. This is the day we celebrate our Resurrected Lord. This is the day the Lord has made for all of us, all of us together as one in Christ, and we will rejoice and be glad in it.

When all the March Madness subsides and all the parties are over, we celebrate the ultimate and eternal victory over sin and death. We hail the all-conquering hero, our saving champion, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Proclaim the Good News, you Lutherans! Proclaim it, too, you Roman Catholics! Shout it abroad, you Methodists, Moravians and Mennonites! All Christians of every faith expression join the chorus! All together now, with one voice, with one faith in one Lord, **He is risen! He is risen, indeed!** Amen.

### Since You Asked

Since You Asked...

#### Who or what is a Gonzaga?

I recently asked several friends that same question. Most had no idea. Some thought it was a Native American tribe of the Pacific Northwest. Others guessed a Gonzaga to be an indigenous name for a river, mountain or American Indian Chief. They're all wrong.

Gonzaga is the surname of St. Aloysius Gonzaga (1568-1591), the Roman Catholic patron saint of youth and students. He is also the patron saint of AIDS sufferers and caretakers. He gives his name to Gonzaga University in Spokane, Washington.

Gonzaga was born into a noble Italian family but gave up his wealth and inheritance to take religious vows and dedicate his life to church ministry. He first expressed his calling at the early age of nine-years-old. Though his family sought to dissuade him, Gonzaga was diligent and dedicated to his calling.

Gonzaga was known to be a precocious student and at a young age was teaching catechism in Roman Catholic schools. His scholarly reputation soon had him tutoring young boys in some of the most prestigious schools in Rome.

When *The Plague* hit Rome in 1591, Gonzaga was at the frontlines tending the sick. After many fellow Jesuits became infected with the disease, their superiors told them they were no longer allowed to nurse the plague victims. Gonzaga challenged their orders and eventually was granted permission to care for the sick and dying. He soon caught the illness and died in service to the Lord at the age of 23.

#### Kuhn You Hear What I Hear?

**Phase II** of our Kuhn Pipe Organ repair, renovation and refurbishment began February 18. The work project continues through the end of March. In the meantime, we will rely on piano and keyboard accompaniment for our worship services. We are assured work will be completed before Palm Sunday, April 14.

Should look up at our organ from the sanctuary, the work will be done on the pipes and other instrumentation on the right side of the organ. Last year, **Phase I** included the pipes on the left side and the organ console itself. **Phase II** completes all scheduled repairs and refurbishments and includes the installation of a new Syndyne switching system with MIDI board.

The work would be done by Peebles-Herzog Pipe Organ Company, Columbus, OH who also did last year's work and with whom we have a continuing service contract for tuning and adjustments, etc. Grace Planning Council, during its July 2018 meeting, approved funds from the Lewis Memorial Capital Improvements Fund pay for the project.



### Protecting Our Children


### <u>CHILDREN'S</u> EASTER EGG HUNT


# Spring Break 2019

### **GROCERY BAG MINISTRY**

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In February, we distributed 117 bags, and have already distributed 62 in March. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. <u>Grocery size</u> <u>paper bags are also needed.</u>


