- And I'm sure our teens do more than I have space for here or even know about.

Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

Greetings, Pastor. I have a question for you. My three year old granddaughter asked me "Does God ever sleep?" I thought about it and told her that I don't think he sleeps, but he might rest. Like when she takes her nap every day. Do you have any suggestions?

This is an excellent question. I'm sure many parents, grandparents and others have had this question asked. Maybe we've heard, "I don't need a nap! God doesn't take one!"

You've also hit on a great answer. It's true. God does not sleep, but he certainly rests.

In Psalm 121: 4, we read, "God neither slumbers or sleeps..." God does not sleep, but constantly and unfailing keeps a careful and close watch over us.

Yet, God needs and takes a rest. After six busy days of creation, God rested as recorded in Genesis 2: 2-3. While Jesus, the Son of God lived among us, he certainly needed time to sleep and get some rest, just like us. Jesus would often go to a quiet place to rest, refresh and re-charge. There are nine examples of this in the Gospels, including Mark 1:35 and Mark 6:45-46.

God wants us and expects us to rest, too. That is why God made a Sabbath day as a day of rest. (Exodus 20:8-11)

God bless you and sleep in heavenly peace.



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In June, we distributed 125 bags, and have already distributed 89 in July. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.






