Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

Pastor, I was surprised to learn that Herodias (aka Salome) was just a little girl when she danced for King Herod. How did you discover this?

I was surprised to learn this too! Like most of us, I had bought into the Hollywood depiction of a sultry, sexy dancer who danced the *Dance of the Seven Veils* and charmed Herod and his guests with her feminine wiles. (If you want a superb and tantalizing depiction of this legend, check out Richard Strauss' opera **Salome.** It's rather sordid, but great entertainment.)

It turns out this portrayal is totally wrong. According to a correct translation of Scripture, Herodias/Salome was just a little girl when she danced at her father's birthday party. Check out verses 22 and 28 in Mark 8. Here Herodias is referred to with the English word "girl." In the original Greek, the word is *karasion*, which is accurately translated as "little girl" or "young girl." It is same word the Gospel writer uses in Mark 5:42, "And immediately the girl (*karasion*) got up and began to walk about (she was twelve years of age)."

So rather than a seductive Rita Hayworth (1953 movie), we have something closer to Shirley Temple singing "On the Good Ship Lollipop" and dancing to please her father and his birthday party guests. Now that's entertainment!

Not only will I be working to improve the lives of those around me by giving medical attention where needed. I will congruently be working to improve my own relationship with God. Serving on mission trips will significantly contribute to my spiritual growth because it seems that in areas of low income, people have faith that God will lead them to better lives, even through hardships. People who have less to live on tend to care more about the intangibles in life, a notion that I find inspiring. Even though they have so little they choose to put all trust in God. 

GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In June, we distributed 137 bags, and have already distributed 119 in July. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.




