# Better than Biscuits!

Indeed, my plans are not like your plans, and my deeds are not like your deeds, for just as the sky is higher than the earth, so my deeds are superior to your deeds and my plans superior to your plans. Isaiah 55:8-9

One of my friends and a faithful chapel volunteer at St. Luke Lutheran Community at North Canton recently sent me this story. I enjoyed it so much; I wish to share it with you.

A minister who served a small rural congregation was attending a men's breakfast. He asked one of the older farmers in attendance to say the prayer that morning.

The farmer began, "Lord, I hate buttermilk." The pastor opened one eye and wondered to himself where this was going. Then the farmer said, "Lord, I hate lard." Now the pastor was worried. But the farmer prayed on, "And Lord, you know I don't care much for raw flour."

The pastor grew concerned. He couldn't figure where the farmer was going with this and even wondered whether he should interrupt. But there was no gracious or "pastoral" way he could do this. So he held his breath and silently prayed for the best.

And so the farmer continued, "But Lord, when you mix 'em all together and bakes 'em up, I do love me those fresh biscuits. So Lord, when things come up we don't like, when life gets hard, when we just don't understand what you are saying to us, when we can't quite get what's goin' on, we just need to relax and wait 'til You are done fixin' and probably it will be somethin' even better than biscuits." Amen.

This fervent and faith-filled prayer to God was also a "teaching moment" for those who heard it. Perhaps, this was most especially so for the minister.

In the Bible verses above, the prophet Isaiah gently, but pointedly, reminds us that God works in His own best way and in his own best time. We may not always understand God's ways; completely recognize God's purpose; quite see God's intended outcome; or fully appreciate God's perfect timing; yet God's plan is always the best plan.

The wise writer of Proverbs echoes the farmer's prayer when he teaches, "Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. (Proverbs 3:5) Or, as St. Paul so familiarly reminds us, "All things work together for good for those who love the Lord and are called according to His purpose." (Romans 8:28)

When give over all the ingredients of our life to God, God will put 'em together in just the right way. God's making somethin' better than biscuits. And, yes, somethin' even better than chocolate. Trust God! Amen.







# Renovation, Repair and Relief

Luther Hall renovations are proceeding as planned. Projects should be completed during the week of August 6. Look for updates in the weekly bulletin insert.

Access to the building will be limited during this time. Please pay attention to the signs posted of entry doors directing access to the building and church offices. This is for **your safety** and the convenience of the workers.

**Church offices remain open and accessible.** Church operations and services have been largely unaffected by the construction.

Sunday School classes are meeting in Youth Hall. Junior and Senior High classes are combined and meet in the Youth Room. Grades 3-6 meet together in the "Boy Scout" room. The adult class meets in the Junior High classroom (formerly Confirmation classroom). Pre-School and 1<sup>st</sup>-2<sup>nd</sup> grade classes will meet in their usual classrooms. All are air conditioned spaces.

Work project includes:

- Renovating both restrooms making both handicapped accessible;
- Remodeling the lounge including fireplace, walls, flooring and furniture;
- Replace flooring in kitchen and multipurpose room;
- Painting walls and replacing ceilings throughout the hall and connecting room; and
- Installing safer railing in the connecting room.

The Lewis Memorial Fund resources are paying for the project. Proceeds from the fund are available only for capital improvement projects as approved by both the Property Ministries Board and Grace Planning Council. Some furniture and decorative improvements are paid from the Building Fund as approved by the Property Board.

# Tuesday, August 15th 9:00 am

In the Gospel of John, Jesus says to his disciples, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me" (14:1).

In my little circle, we're all kind of stressed out right now. We're all anxious about a friend's health. We're all worried about projects getting done on time. We're all uneasy about the state of the world. We're all annoyed about—well, you name it, we're annoyed about it.

What's worse, we're passing stress around to each other like a bad cold.

And Jesus says not to let our hearts be troubled? Doesn't he know what's going on here? Is he trying to tell us not to stress, not to worry, not to freak out?

Well, yes. Yes, he is. And he says it again, even stronger, just a few verses later: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid" (14:27). Jesus talks about peace all the time. Whenever he shows up, he says, "Peace be with you." But he's not saying "Peace and love, dudes and dudettes" like our favorite old hippie brother-in-law.

This kind of peace doesn't mean that all the worrisome things outside of us are changed—it doesn't mean that suddenly our friends are all healthy and our computers are all cooperating and our world leaders are all a whole lot wiser. No, it means that we are changed. Our hearts are changed. We know, deep in our hearts, that in the end, everything will be all right. And with this kind of peace in our hearts, we can trust and love and serve and give with joy and hope and generosity. This is the peace Jesus talks about all the time. This is the peace Jesus gives us. This is the peace of Christ. May the peace of Christ be always with you. And also with you, and with you, and with you too. Pass it on!

#### **GROCERY BAG MINISTRY**

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In June, we distributed 79 bags, and have already distributed 62 in July. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. **Grocery size** paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.


