Carrying the Christ Child

As another Christmas season rolls around, my thoughts again turn to what a miracle it is that God would risk coming to live with us as one of us. That God would come and be born as a baby, completely dependent on the care of his parents is an amazing risk. God takes this risk willingly, purposefully, and does it entirely for our benefit, so that we might be able to live with him eternally.

It is impossible for me to write about the birth of Christ this year without also thinking about the birth of our son in just a few more days. I am struck by the wonder of a child, the miracle of birth itself, the delicate nature of the whole process and yet somehow, someway, a child is born and lives and grows. As any parent can say, there is something truly amazing about the birth of a child and it is one of the primary times in life when there can be little doubt that God is involved with this world and with our lives.

Still the thing that strikes me most about the birth of Jesus Christ is that, because he is born, as an infant, he is born dependent upon human beings for his survival. He is born vulnerable, frail, and in need of almost everything. That God could be born in this way is almost unthinkable. That God would entrust his only Son to human parents is truly amazing. And yet Jesus is still entrusting us with his life. Jesus has done all that he came to do in his life, death, and resurrection and when his work was finished he gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples so that they, and in turn we, could share the truth of the Gospel with all the world. Jesus born an infant, dependent upon Mary and Joseph for all of his needs, is still working in miraculous ways through simple, flawed but faithful people like you and me. May God find us as faithful in the Christmas season of carrying his message of salvation as he found Mary and Joseph of carrying the gift of the Christ child who brought salvation to the world in the first place.

SYNOD ASSEMBLY—SATURDAY, DECEMBER 2ND

There will be a specially called synod assembly on **Saturday, December 2, 2006** at **Emidio and Sons Banquet Center**, 48 E. Bath Road (at State Road) in Cuyahoga Falls. That assembly's only business will be the election of a bishop. The new bishop's term will begin February 1, 2007. That person will serve for a full six-year term. The subsequent election will take place at the 2013 synod assembly.

On December 2nd, we will worship and pray and sing and socialize in between ballots (and eat!). Doors will open at 7:30 a.m. for registration and a light breakfast. Opening prayer and the first ballot will be at 8:30 a.m. The tentative agenda calls for adjournment around 4:30 p.m.

CHRISTMAS IN DOVER PARADE—SATURDAY, DECEMBER 2ND—5:30 P.M.

The city of Dover will be hosting its annual Christmas in Dover parade on Saturday, December 2nd, starting at the intersection of 4th Street and Betscher Avenue, with line up taking place on Betscher Avenue between 4th Street and the football stadium. Dover returns to the traditional Christmas parade of years past with an evening event beginning at 5:30 p.m. followed by the annual Downtown Christmas Lighting ceremony on the city square. The lighting ceremony will include performances by members of the Dover Band and Choir and sing along caroling. The now-traditional reading of 'Twas the Night Before Christmas' by his honor, Mayor Richard Homrighausen, will be followed by the arrival of Santa Claus and the opening of the Santa House for children of all ages to share their Christmas wish lists with Santa. Refreshments will be available on the square for those attending, sponsored by local service organizations.

Youth Hall update:




Youth Zone for 9th-12th Graders




