The Best Place for Snow

God thunders wondrously with His voice; He does great things that we cannot comprehend. For to the snow He says, "Fall on the earth"; and the shower of rain, His heavy shower of rain, serves as a sign on everyone's hand, so that all whom He has made may know it. Job 37:6-7

Where is the best place for snow?

If you're talking quantities, the best place for snow, as I write this, is western New York. Until you see the pictures on the Weather Channel, it's hard to imagine what 65 inches of fallen snow looks like. Everything is covered and has come to a stand-still. People cannot get out of their homes. Some motorists have been stranded in their vehicles for up to forty hours. Interstate 90 is completely shut down for 136 miles. As Sam Champion would say, "It's amazing out there!"

I like the snow. It makes for a beautiful, crystalline landscape. Polo **loves** the snow. He enjoys romping about as if he were back in his ancestral Himalayas. But hey, enough's enough! To me anything over a few inches is overkill.

When flurries turn to blizzards, as the tiny, pretty snowflakes become massive, ugly snowdrifts, the best place for snow is inside a snow globe. That I can handle. That I can enjoy in the cozy, warmth of my home.

I love **snow globes**. In fact, I collect them. At last count, I have 43 of them. They're all on display for the holidays and many remain out for show throughout the winter. Every room of the house has a snow globe or two or four or more accenting my décor. There are snowmen and Santas, Christmas trees and cardinals, Holy Nativities and country churches and more... I even have one with howling holiday hounds. I'm sure that one is Polo's favorite.

There's not much snow in a snow globe—just enough to make a delightful scene. There's not much snow in the Bible either—just enough to keep us reminded of God's power and grace. I just did a word search for snow and found only 23 mentions out of the thousands of verses in Scripture.

Some of these citations remind us of the forgiveness of our sins. "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be whiter than snow." (Isaiah 1:18) "Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow. (Psalm 51:7)

Others refer to Jesus and His glorious, heavenly countenance as when He was transfigured between Moses and Elijah on the mountaintop in Matthew 28:3, or as He will appear in heaven. His head and His hair were white as white wool, white as snow; His eyes were like a flame of fire... (Revelation 1:14)

Still other verses keep us mindful of God's rule and control over creation. Heaven and earth all full of his glory and all God has created honor Him and give witness to His goodness. "Praise the Lord from the earth...fire and hail, snow and frost, stormy wind fulfilling His command!" (Psalm 148:8)

Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

Pastor, you've shared a variety of Advent Wreath traditions with us during the past few years. What tradition will you be sharing with us this year?

This year, I will be introducing the Advent Tradition of our Eastern Orthodox brothers and sisters in Christ. Whereas, Western traditions relate spiritual gifts (prophecy, love, peace and joy) or persons (prophets, angels, Mary and shepherds), the Eastern Orthodox Christianity connects the candles to events in the Advent-Christmas story.

The first candle is the **Expectation**, the world's historic longing and anticipation of a Savior. The second candle denotes the **Annunciation**, the Christian celebration of the announcement by the archangel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary that she would become the mother of Jesus Christ the Son of God. John the Baptist's **Proclamation** of the Messiah, the Light coming into the world, is depicted by the third candle. The **Fulfillment**, the fourth Advent candle, honors Christ as the eternal King of heaven and earth. Here we recall how Jesus, at his First Advent, was born a humble babe in a lowly manger, but soon will return in power and great glory as the King of Kings, the Lord of Lords and Prince of Peace.

I pray you will enjoy and learn from this different perspective on Advent celebrations.



Advent Stories and Christmas Letters

The Church Year begins with the First Sunday in Advent, November 30. The 10:30 worship service will recognize our youth who will be receiving their First Communion that day.

Sundays in Advent will feature some of Pastor Rice's favorite **Advent Stories** which highlight Christ's message of salvation and His Christmas gifts of love, peace, joy and life. The 8:00 and 10:30 a.m. services will begin with the lighting of the candles on the Advent Wreath and include some of our favorite Advent songs and Christmas carols.

Children's Christmas Pageant

Youth of all ages will present **Christmas Letters** as our annual Christmas pageant. They will perform at 9:30 a.m. on December 21. There will be *only one service* this day. In this play, children write and read letters to Joseph, Mary, the Innkeeper, a Shepherd, an Angel and the Baby Jesus. The Biblical characters respond with read responses. After the pageant, the worship continues with Holy Communion.

Holy Communion Worship Services will be offered at 7:00 and 10:00 p.m. on December 24. Come, join us for this festival of love, light and love as we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ our Lord.

Sunday after Christmas

There will be only one worship service on Sunday, December 28. It will be a "Service of Word and Song." Pastor Rice will preside and preach.

First Day, First Communion




Holiday Time

Hammerstrom Scholarship Essays

Jaclyn Sergent's Hammerstrom Scholarship Essay -

I have been attending Cleveland State University for four years. I will be starting my fifth year of college this fall as a senior in Cleveland State University's Nursing Program. This program will allow me to receive my Bachelors of Science and Nursing by May 2015. After Graduating from nursing school, I will then have to take my boards to be certified as registered nurse in the state of Ohio. Once I have accomplished passing boards, I will gain experience working as a nurse in Ohio. I have not found a certain specialty that I would like to pursue right now, but I'm interested in OR, Pediatrics, Neonates, and Post-Op. To accomplish these goals, I have started working at Cleveland Clinic- Main Campus, on a colorectal step-down ICU as a nursing assistant and I am also working on the surgical unit at Union Hospital as a Patient Care Tech. These jobs are allowing me to learn more about the nursing atmosphere and educate me on the new and innovative happenings going on in the health care system. In school, I have maintained good academic standings and been on the dean's list. I am also the Treasurer for the Student Nurses Association at CSU. This scholarship will help me reach these goals by helping with books and tuition. This scholarship is has been a blessing to be for the past four years and I am very grateful for having such a supportive and loving church. I cannot wait to see what God has in store for me down this road I'm on.

Aaronn Sergent's Hammerstrom Scholarship Essay -

I believe that, by being morally good and improving the lives of those around you, you are serving God, doing as Jesus would do, and, clearly, benefiting the community. As an engineer, I would be working to improve quality of life daily, and, not just for profit, but because, personally, helping others is rewarding itself. My current education plan is to complete my Bachelor's in Mechanical Engineering and pursue a Master's in either Business Administration or another designation of engineering. I am also considering completing a dual B.S./M.S. program to finish my schooling early. I want to be working and making a difference as soon as possible.

Following the completion of my college education, I hope to working on projects involving a mix of mechanical and medical application. Currently, I hope to work on surgical robotics, improving the time, accuracy, and precision of surgeries, while maintaining a need for a surgeon but nearly completely eliminating room for human error. Otherwise, I have discovered a growing interest in the advancement of prosthetics. The capability of prosthetics to change the original vision of physical disability as being disabling has recently been transformed to being enabling, and it is miraculous and exciting to think that those people will not have to suffer or be ridiculed as much anymore. In these applications, I plan to continue to serve God through my work and benefit not only Dover but also the international community, and it is a college education that will enable me to do so.



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In Oct., we distributed 131 bags, and have already distributed 110 in November. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.
