Since You Asked...

Merry Christmas! I'm already listening to and enjoying Christmas carols. I have a religious Christmas song CD which includes *Good King Wenceslas.* Is that a Christian Christmas carol?

I consider *Good King Wenceslas* to be a "day-after Christmas" carol since it celebrates "The Feast of Stephen" on December 26. St. Stephen was among the first deacons of the church who were selected to care for the poor, widows and orphans. He was the first Christian martyr (Acts, chapter 6-7).

Good King Wenceslas was considered a "St. Stephen" of his time. He is highly regarded by the Bohemian (Czech) people for his saintly example and benevolent rule.

King Wenceslas ruled Bohemia (Czech Republic) from 924-929 AD. During his reign he promoted Christianity throughout his kingdom, much of which was yet to be evangelized. He was known for being exceptionally kind and generous to the poor, especially children. King Wenceslas was assassinated by his brother Boleslaw who had invited him to a religious festival. He attacked and murdered the King on his way there.

King Wenceslas is regarded as a saint and martyr by Bohemian and many other Christians. The Roman Catholic and Anglican churches commemorate Good King Wenceslas on September 28.

Advent 2016: The Road to Bethlehem

Our Advent Sundays this year will take us on a road trip to Bethlehem. We will begin our journey in Jesus' hometown of Nazareth and make the 70-mile, four-day trip south to his Bethlehem birthplace. Our Advent journey will include a side trip with Mary as she visits her dear relative Elizabeth in the Judean hill country. We will also spend some time along the way in the historical city of Jericho which would figure significantly in Jesus' ministry.

Advent Sundays will also include the lighting of the Advent Wreath at the beginning of each Sunday Worship Service. As we prepare our hearts and minds to welcome anew the Holy Christ Child, we remember and rejoice in God's Christmas blessings of **Hope**, **Peace**, **Joy** and **Love**.

Eighty three voting members overwhelmingly approved the proposed church budget for 2017. The \$276,695.00 budget is a two per-cent increase above this year's projected income.

Voters also elected Dwayne Shepherd and Lizabeth Nelson to second three-year terms on the Grace Lutheran Endowment Board. Dwayne currently serves as the board's President. Liz serves as its Treasurer.

GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In October, we distributed 127 bags, and have already distributed 142 in November. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. <u>Grocery size</u> <u>paper bags are also needed.</u>


