### **Perfect Timing**

<sup>4</sup>But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, <sup>5</sup>in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children. Galatians 4:5

(Isaiah 55:8-9)

This year, as we celebrate **Christmas**, we thank God for His perfect gift, His perfect Son and His perfect timing. Doing this on December 25<sup>th</sup> would be just the thing to do

### Since You Asked

### Since You Asked...

#### What is the oldest Christmas carol?

Oh, that's an easy one! The first Christmas carol is the divine song of the angels joyfully announcing Jesus' birth. *Gloria in Excelsis Deo!* Glory to God in the highest and peace, goodwill to all people on earth.

Now if you inquiring about a human composition, that's going to be a bit tougher.

According to my diligent and scholarly research, it seems the oldest earthly Christmas carol is *Of the Father's Love Begotten*. It is based on a Latin poem by the Roman poet Aurelius Prudentius dating back to 413 A.D. The melody accompanying these words and still used today is a medieval European Plainsong. You may find this ancient carol in our hymnbook as hymn 295. The first two verses are:

Of the Father's love begotten, Ere the worlds began to be, He is Alpha and Omega, He the source, the ending He, Of the things that are, that have been, And that future years shall see, Evermore and evermore!

O that birth forever blessèd, When the virgin, full of grace, By the Holy Ghost conceiving, Bore the Savior of our race; And the Babe, the world's Redeemer, First revealed His sacred face, Evermore and evermore!

### Advent: Jesus! Name Above All Names

Our weekly Gospel Acclamation proclaims Jesus is the Name Above All Names! It includes various Biblical titles for our Lord.

Throughout the Holy Scriptures, Jesus is referenced by many titles. In the Hebrew Scriptures, the world awaits the arrival of God's promised Messiah, the Savior of the world, God's Chosen One, our Redeemer. These along with many others are given in eager expectation of the Christ and his saving grace.

The prophet Isaiah offers several titles, too. Among them, he anticipates the Christ as our **Everlasting Light, Prince** of Peace, Emmanuel and Glory of the Lord. These particular names for Jesus will be the focus of our 2017 Advent worship.

Advent Sundays will also include the lighting of the Advent Wreath at the beginning of each Sunday Worship Service. This year, we will prepare our hearts and minds for the coming of the Holy Christ Child by remembering and honoring his holy names as proclaimed by the prophet Isaiah.






### The Bells of Christmas Chime Once More

### **GROCERY BAG MINISTRY**

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In October, we distributed 135 bags, and have already distributed 125 in October. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. **Grocery size** paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.


