"They like me! They REALLY LIKE ME!" (Pause to admire the statuette. Notice a small team forming in the corner of the eye and slowing making it way down a flushed cheek.) "I would like to thank Brody, Will and Michele for their constant encouragement and their inspiring performances. Thank you, thank you, thank you all! (Riotous applause erupts!)

In American theater, there are the Tonys (Broadway), the Obies (off-Broadway) and now, thanks to my imagination, the O-O-O-OBIES (off-off-off Broadway). The most latter includes Tuscarawus County!

As many of you know, I recently appeared as Rev. Hopkins in the Tuscarawas Little Theater production of *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever*. It was great fun. I enjoyed all four performances. I met some wonderful children and interesting adults. Without question, I would do it again.

The only problem was there was a bug going around. The "flu bug" and the "cold bug" hit several cast members during and after our two-week run. But much more infectious was the "acting bug." Once you've caught it, it is hard to shake. No medications can cure it. Only intense therapy has a chance to alleviate its symptoms. That's the "bug" I got!

Actually, I think this "bug" was dormant in my system for some time. It just needed the right opportunity, the right conditions to erupt. And there I was, at the right time, the right place, and right ready to succumb to its virulence.

I am not cured. The "bug" is a very persistent one. So to ease the symptoms, I will strive to "take on the character" and tell the story of several Christian martyrs during our midweek Lenten series, **ft the Cross Roads**. The series begins with the first Christian deacon and martyr, St. Stephen and concludes with Jesus' first called disciple, St. Andrew. (Please see article on page 6.)

Similar to last year's **Beneath the Cross of Jesus** "bathrobe monologues," each week's "guest presenters" will tell his story and how the sacrificial and atoning cross of Jesus impacted his life. I pray these depictions will give us all opportunity to reflect on the meaning of Jesus' cross and what it means to "live for righteousness." How does Jesus' saving sacrifice empower and guide us as we face daily challenges, make decisions and seek to serve him in love?

Lent begins Ash Wednesday, February 13. The 6:45 p.m. service includes the Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion. A 5:45 p.m. Lenten Soup and Sandwich Supper precedes this and all Wednesday evening services.

So, let's meet **At the CrossRoads** where we find Jesus' leading us onward and upward in our journey of faith, hope and love. Amen.

Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

Ash Wednesday and Easter are very early this year. Why do the dates keep changing so much? How are the dates determined?

Ash Wednesday is always forty days before Easter. The date of Easter varies from year to year.

The First Council of Nicaea* in 325 AD established the date of Easter as the first Sunday after the first full moon which happens upon or immediately following the 21st day of March. If the first full moon happens upon a Sunday, Easter Day is the Sunday after." Why such an odd definition? March 21 is the **vernal equinox** -- the day on which the length of daylight equals the length of darkness as the days are lengthening in the spring. The traditional Jewish calendar is based on moon phases, which is how the phase of the moon enters into the definition. When the Council was determining what day Easter would fall on, it deferred to the Jewish practice of using moon phases to decide the timing of holidays. Thus, Christianity's Easter corresponds to the Jewish Passover in both date and symbolism. Using this method, Easter can only occur between March 22 and April 25. This year, we celebrate Easter on March 31. Easter will be celebrated on April 20 next year 2014. That's some difference!

*This is also the Church Council which gave us the Nicene Creed.

Children's Chorus Come Sing With Us!



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In December, we distributed 116 bags, and have already distributed 145 in January. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

PERSONAL CARE KITS AND **SCHOOL KITS**

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Personal Care Kits

1 light weight bath towel (dark color) 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file

School Kits

- 4 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11"; do not include loose leaf paper
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 "long
 - 5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons, 5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.
