## Since You Asked...

I noticed baptized children receive quite a few gifts on this special occasion. I don't sit close enough to see what they all are. Could you enlighten me?

Grace Lutheran presents a baptized child with several gifts and mementos at baptism. It is a day of celebration and we pray these gifts enhance the significance of the day for the child, parents and sponsors (godparents). These gifts include:

An embossed baptismal napkin is used to dry the brow of the child. This memento is usually embroidered with a baptismal dove or scalloped shell.

A baptismal candle reminds us of Jesus' words "Let your light shine before others so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:16)

A Dutch Cradle Cross is engraved with the Biblical citation Matthew 18:4. (I do not know the tradition behind this gift. If anyone does, I'd be happy to hear from you.)

A baptismal certificate is a keepsake record of the day's event. A Bible Storybook shares God Word as the child grows in God's grace.

# Cross My Heart: Jesus Touches Our Lives with His Love

Our midweek evening Lenten worship services begin Ash Wednesday at 6:45 in the sanctuary. The service will include the Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion. The Wednesday evening services continue through March 25. A Soup and Sandwich Supper precedes these services at 5:30 p.m. in Luther Hall.

Our Lenten theme this year is: *Cross My heart: Jesus Touches Our Lives with His Love*. Each Wednesday a guest presenter will relate how Jesus loved him and changed his life. #### And the Survey Says...

Grace Lutheran Planning Council will be conducting a survey on Sunday, February 15 concerning our summer worship schedule. Pastor Rice and Council have been approached with suggestions that we have one service during the summer months.



The one service would be held at 9:30 a.m. June through August. Two services at 8:00 and 10:30 a.m. would resume the first Sunday in September and continue through the last Sunday May.

Since this is a significant change and a major break from tradition, Planning Council has decided to poll the congregation for feedback. A survey will be placed in all bulletins at both services on February 15. It will ask whether you think this is a good idea or not. It will also provide space for comments.

Many congregations have adopted a summer month schedule and have seen no significant variable in attendance or giving. Some actually see a larger attendance and some see a bit less. Many invite the opportunity for people from both services to mix, mingle and worship together. It also provides a means to adapt to summer activity and vacation schedules.

Sunday School would go on hiatus June through August, giving Sunday School teachers, helpers and students a summer break. This can be seen as having both benefits and drawbacks. Sunday School would follow the two worship service schedule September through May.

Please take time to complete the February 15 survey and offer you thoughts on the matter. You may place your survey in the day's offering plate or turn it into the office that week.

#### **GROCERY BAG MINISTRY**

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In Dec., we distributed 124 bags, and have already distributed 126 in January. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.


