Resolutions for a Simple Church

'Tis the season for making changes in your life. For jumping back into all the projects and goals that the busyness of life got the best of in the past year and the promise of a new year gives hope to once again. New Year's resolutions, those oft begun, seldom finished goals that if only we could stay the course we are certain would improve our lives and the lives of those around us in significant ways. If only we could stay the course. In order to stay the course you will need some support to make it happen. You'll need to seek out some trusted friends who can encourage you, hold you accountable, help you start again when old habits begin to take hold again and the goals you have set start to seem unattainable.

With that in mind I'm proposing that we as a church resolve to do a few things in the coming year as well in order to truly be Christ followers.

- 1. Study: We don't become followers of Christ naturally, we need to learn how to follow. And if we are to learn anything we will need to do some studying. Study the Bible, not only to know what is in it, but to learn how it makes a difference in our lives. Study the world around us to see how it stacks up against the life God has called us into and where we have an opportunity to change it to make it more like the Kingdom of God we are called to build.
- 2. Serve: Just as we don't become followers of Christ without study, we don't become servants of the Lord without action. Study is only the beginning, for once we begin to understand the Bible and see the world for what it is and what it could be we have to get involved and do something. We need to serve. Serve neighbors, serve brothers and sisters in Christ, serve strangers, serve the least of these, serve Christ.
- 3. Share: Following Christ is not meant to be done alone. Christ followers are called to relationships. When we share with others both inside and outside the church the things we are learning as we study and the ways our study is getting us to serve, we not only help others to see the ways God is active in our world, but we invite them to share in the journey with us. We invite others to come alongside of us and to invite us to come alongside of them as together we encourage, strengthen, and support one another to simply live for Christ every day in every way.




Lent invites you to discover "The Life You've Always Wanted"

They painted houses, weeded and trimmed overgrown driveways, cleaned and painted churches, taught children about the love of God at Kids Club, and served residents of a local nursing home and a care facility for mentally and physically challenged people.
