BEGINNING A NEW YEAR

How does one begin a new year? With resolutions? With cleaning closets, attics and garages – both in our homes and in our minds and on our calendars? I guess all of those would be good ways to begin a new year. But we all know that resolutions often don't last to the end of the month. And cleaning can quickly become an overwhelming task. So are there some alternatives?

How about beginning a new year with a simple prayer that will be said every morning no matter how much we may dread the coming day? The simple phrase, "Thank you God for this new day" will work. And if you want to expand on that, say the Lord's prayer at least once a day. It is certainly a very familiar prayer that speaks to the best and worst of what life may seem to be throwing at us on any day.

How about calling one friend each day, or maybe once a week to simply ask, "How things going for you?" The reason for the call is primarily to <u>listen</u>. The conversation may be very brief, or it may become an hour long listening session. And it may very well lead to prayer, either on the phone, or silently in your mind while you are listening. The alternative is sending a simple note, or card to that friend.

How about setting aside five dollars worth of food, paper products, soap, toothpaste, etc. for the food pantry, or simply donate the \$5 and let the food pantry folk use it to purchase food? For some, the \$5 may be a stretch. Good, stretch! For some, the \$5 may be, what some may call "chump change", in other words, not really a significant amount. If that's the case, make it \$20 a week. Whatever the amount, it would remind us that while we may have enough, there are those brothers and sisters who do not have enough. And we are called to share with those in need. It says so in the Bible! In red letters, which means that is what Jesus is telling us to do.

I hope that is enough to get you started in figuring out how to begin a new year. You might have already have given that some thought. But I will add one more suggestion just in case. Begin the new year with a recognition that "good intentions" of the old year were often simply that – "good intentions". Being realistic about what we can and what we will do is part of the challenge of getting off to a good start in 2010. However, what we can and will do will probably not be a great deal unless we recognize that we can ultimately do nothing without the help of God.

May we grow in our ability to recognize our limitations. But may we also grow in our ability to recognize our limitless potential with the help of God as we begin the year 2010.



The camps (two camps of 3 days each) were attended by over 110 children. And best of all, more than twenty of them prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior! The staff did such an awesome job.



Yes, the kids had a great time playing games, swimming in the pool, and eating great food. But more importantly, they had a great time hearing and learning the Word of God. In those three days, we were able to squeeze in six teaching times.

The Word of Life missionaries did everything from cooking to counseling, and teaching to trash pickup. There were also some terrific volunteers from local churches. And special thanks to the group of eleven from our home church (First Baptist Port Charlotte, Florida) who gave up their Thanksgiving to help us.



Our theme was "Joseph, a Life of Many Colors". From the story of Joseph's life, the children learned that God will never leave them or forsake them, and that He works all things together for good for them that love Him and are called according to His purposes. (Romans 8:28) Many of these children have huge difficulties in their lives, and we pray that they will be able to hold on to the promises of God and trust Him to bring those promises to pass in His perfect timing.






