...he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb. Luke 2:21

Pastor Ezekiel Rice. How does that grab you?

It doesn't sound all that Lutheran does it? It sounds more Southern Baptist or Pentecostal to me. Martin, Luther, Paul or Mark—now those are "Lutheran" names.

Ezekiel. That's what my Dad wanted to name me before I was born. I would be called Zeke for short. Fortunately, I think, my Mother persuaded him otherwise. Maybe she appealed to his ego or family tradition. I would be named after him, Donald, Jr.

What's in a name?

There are some who would argue a child's name has an impact on their lives throughout childhood and even into adulthood. I wonder how great that impact can be.

Ezekiel. Hmmm. Maybe instead of a pastor I would have been an orthopedist or chiropractor. "Dem bones, dem bones, dem dry bones..." (Ezekiel 37). Or, maybe a NASCAR driver propelling the "fiery wheel" around the racetrack (Ezekiel 1).

Of course, like Ezekiel himself, I could still be a preacher---though probably not a Lutheran one. Maybe I'd be working for Joel Osteen or Joyce Meyers. Or, better yet, they'd be working for me.

What's in a name?

On the eighth day after his birth, the Holy Child of Bethlehem was named Jesus. This was the name selected by God and declared by the angel Gabriel to Joseph before Jesus was born. It is a name of significant meaning. It is a name of God's perfect plan and purpose.

Jesus means "Savior," "God saves" or "Lord of salvation." The exact Hebrew etymology is unclear, but the message is certain, strong and bold. In the name of Jesus, we have the forgiveness of all our sin; the true and sure promise of eternal life; and the ever-abiding presence of a personal Savior who cares.

Jesus lives up to his name. He is the "Lord of our Salvation" now and forever. As St. Paul reminds us, "...at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2:10-11)

What's in name?

When it comes to the name of Jesus, what's in a name is everything. Amen.

- 2. Hope—to expect with confidence
- 3. Charity—benevolent goodwill, generosity and helpfulness
- 4. Prudence—self-discipline and wise use of resources
- 5. Justice—the quality of being just, impartial or fair
- 6. Temperance—self-control and moderation in the indulgence of appetites or passions
- 7. Fortitude—strength of mind and character, courage.

There are also the **Seven Acts of Mercy**. These may be found in Matthew 25 and include: feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, give shelter to strangers, clothe the naked, visit the sick, minister to prisoners, and bury the dead.





GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In November, we distributed 101 bags, and have already distributed 92 in December. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

The residents eat dinner at 6:00 each evening. All tableware is provided by the shelter, and they ask that if we are just dropping the food off to bring it in disposable pans.

HEALTH KITS AND LAYETTES

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Health Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Health Kits

1 hand towel (dark color) 1 wash cloth (dark color),1 bath size bar of soap 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file 1 wide tooth comb, 6 band-aids

School Kits

Padded or spinal notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11" totaling 150-200 sheets; do not include loose leaf paper

> 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 "long

6 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

12 sheets of construction paper in assorted colors

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons
