Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

I'm curious. How many Lutherans are currently serving in the United States Congress? Who are they?

There are **23 Lutherans** currently serving in Congress. Lutherans are represented by five senators and eighteen US representatives.

Lutherans serving in the Senate include our own Sherrod Brown (D-Ohio), Jeff Merkley (D-Ore.), Tim Johnson (D-S.D.), and Ron Johnson (R-Wis.) and Martin Heinrich (D-N.M.). All are members of the ELCA except Ron Johnson who is a Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) member.

In the House of Representatives, 11 members belong to ELCA congregations, six belong to Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) churches, and one, Rep. Ron Kind (D-Wis.) attends a WELS congregation.

ELCA members elected to the 113th Congress are Tom Petri (R-Wis.), Denny Heck (D-Wash.), Diane Black (R-Tenn.), John Carter (R-Texas), Bill Shuster (R-Pa.), Tim Walz (D-Minn.), Collin Peterson (D-Minn.), Chellie Pingree (D-Maine), Tom Latham (R-Iowa), Zoe Lofgren (D-Calif.), and Lois Capps (D-Calif.). Six of these ELCA members are Democrats; five are Republicans.

The LCMS members are Cynthia Lummis (R-Wyo.), Dave Reichert (R-Wash.), Erik Paulsen (R-Minn.), Larry Buschon (R-Ind.), John Shimkus (R-Ill.), and Cory Gardner (R-Colo.).

Hammerstrom Scholarship

Ten Grace Youth Awarded Hammerstrom Scholarships

Ten Grace Lutheran college students received awards of \$5,000 from the Hammerstrom Scholarship Fund. The fund is administered by an elected board chosen by our congregation.





GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In May, we distributed 104 bags, and have already distributed 88 in June. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

concerned citizens from various churches and social service agencies in the county who have recognized the need to assist persons experiencing homelessness. The residents eat dinner at 6:00 each evening. All tableware is provided by the shelter, and they ask that if we are just dropping the food off to bring it in disposable pans.

PERSONAL CARE KITS AND SCHOOL KITS

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Personal Care Kits

1 light weight bath towel (dark color) 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file

School Kits

- 4 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11"; do not include loose leaf paper
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 "long
 - 5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons, 5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band


