Since You Asked

Since You Asked...

Pastor, in Sunday's (June 19) Gospel lesson, Jesus casts out evil spirits from a man and sends them into swine. If the Jews could not eat pork and considered pigs so unclean, what were swine doing in the countryside in the first place? (By the way, those piggy footballs you gave the children during the children's message were so cute!)

Thanks! That's a good observation and question. I've been asked this before.

If we take a close look at the context of the Bible Story, Jesus has moved from land of Galilee to the country of the Gerasenes, on the opposite side of the sea. Having left Jewish territory Jesus has now taken his ministry to the Gentiles. Though the Jews would have nothing to do with swine, the Gentiles had no such aversion. Gentiles raised pigs for food and tanned their hides for leather goods. (Though I'm sure none were made into footballs.)

Many farmers made quite a profitable living from their swineherds. That is why so many Gerasenes were upset by Jesus' miracle. They were more concerned with lost income than with a "wild man" who had been tortured by demons and was now made well; ready to return to society as an accepted and productive neighbor and friend.



Sanctuary Painting

The church sanctuary will be repainted beginning Monday, July 11. The work will be done by Murray Schlabach Painting.

The repainting should take two weeks. While this is being done, both Sunday worship services will be held in Fellowship Hall on July 17 and July 24. These services will follow "Service of the Word" liturgies with no Holy Communion. We hope to return to the sanctuary for Holy Communion worship on July 31.

The repainting includes wall, window and ceiling patching and other repairs. The ceilings will be painted white. The walls will be painted "crisp linen" which is a warmer, a touch more golden color which is a warmer hue than we have now.

Thank you for your patience and consideration as we complete this property improvement.







GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In May, we distributed 141 bags, and have already distributed 133 in June. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.


