Since You Asked

Since You Asked ...

Pastor, I enjoyed meeting Jethro during your Father's Day sermon. He sure had some wise, fatherly advice for Moses. Can you tell us more about him?

Sure! I'd be pleased to do that.

In Exodus 18, Jethro visits the Israelite camp near Mount Sinai where he reunites Moses with his wife Zipporah and his two sons, Gershom and Eliezer. Moses had sent his wife and sons to his father-in-law's home in land of Midian to keep them safe while he confronted Pharaoh in seeking the deliverance of the Israelites from their slavery in Egypt.

Moses had married Zipporah while he tended her father's great flock as a shepherd. He had fled Egypt after killing, in a fit of anger, an Egyptian who was beating an Israelite slave. Moses fled to Midian and met Zipporah at a well. She then convinced her father Jethro to take him on as a shepherd (Exodus 2:11-22). It was in Midian that Moses would encounter God in the "Burning Bush" and the Exodus of God people begins.

Scripture tells us that in addition to being a wealthy sheepherder, Jethro was also a Midian priest (Exodus 18:1). By many accounts, he is the Father of the Druze religion. The Druze religion is a monotheistic, Abrahamic religion found chiefly in Syria and adjoining lands. In other words, the Druze believe in one, true God and share many of the same religious beliefs as the descendants of Abraham. Remember, Abraham had two sons, Ishmael and Isaac. Isaac was a Jewish patriarch. Though Ishmael was not, he would have relayed his father Abraham's beliefs to his descendants. These beliefs would then evolve into the Druze religion.

It's interesting to note, the Jews were not the only Abrahamic, monotheistic (One, true God) religion in the Middle East. There were others. Yet, it was the Jews (Israelites) that God chose to reveal the fullness of His glory and truth.







GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In May, we distributed 104 bags, and have already distributed 92 in June. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. **Grocery size** paper bags are also needed.


