#### A Look Ahead to the Future of Grace

On **Sunday, June 18**<sup>th</sup> **at 9:15** in the Fellowship Hall, there will be an important **congregational meeting** as we consider adoption of a new constitution for our congregation and appoint new Planning Council officers, Ministry Board directors and Ministry Board members. While that is the business of the meeting, the reality of this meeting is that we will be turning a new page in the ministry of Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church. This year's Planning Council has been working very hard at a process of prayer, discernment, and vision for our congregation as we seek to continue to be a shining light for Christ in the community of Dover and throughout the surrounding communities. Here's some of the major ministry additions we will be working on together as we seek to be the church God has called us to be. As you will see, there's a place for everyone and we will need your prayers, your willing assistance, and your added vision to make this plan a reality.

The Christian Education Board will be spearheading a campaign that we hope every family in our congregation will be a part of as we kick off the Bible in 90 Days Campaign this Fall. The first action step in our mission statement is "To Know Christ" and we can think of no better way than to help you read through the Bible in its entirety, grasping the big picture of the salvation story from creation to incarnation to resurrection to the birth and growth of the church. By committing 45 minutes a day, less time than your favorite TV show, you can uncover the story of the Bible in ways you've never seen before. We believe that our congregation will come alive more than ever, as the Word of God is front and center in our lives. Christian Ed will also be implementing a new family based faith-development program called Stepping Stones with the help of the Young People's Board and Evangelism Board. You can read more about it in this newsletter. Look for the article on Christian Education RE:think.

- The **Evangelism Board** will be working hard to make sure that our congregation is highlighted in all of the parades, festivals, and events that happen in our community. They will be working to highlight the ministry that is happening, share the message of the Gospel in simple ways, and make sure that every person in our community knows that Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church is a church that is alive with the Spirit and eager to serve the community.
- They will also be developing along with the **Fellowship Board** a program that will train individuals or couples to serve as **Neighborhood Shepherds**. Neighborhood Shepherds will be given the responsibility of reaching out in tangible ways to the members and others who live in their neighborhood. As new people move into the neighborhood, they will be the first to know so that they can drop off a welcome packet for them. They will be able to check in with our members to see if they have prayer concerns or praises that we can help out or celebrate with them. And occasionally they will host get-togethers that allow everyone in the neighborhood to get to know one another, and discover the joy of Christian community.
- The Fellowship Board will be working to develop a Parish Nurse and Wellness program that will better serve the growing medical needs of our congregation. The program will utilize nurses and trained medical persons in our congregation to provide services like blood pressure screenings, prescription counseling, doctor visit rides and assistance, and more. The program will benefit many in our congregation and community who have need of medical assistance and counseling.

The Lay Ministry Board will be developing visitation teams that will be trained and equipped to pray with and bring communion to our shut-ins. Pastor Drake will mentor these teams and help to introduce them to our members, allowing our shut-ins to be served more often by more people in our congregation.

- The **Property Board** will be adding some "**Jesus in Blue Jean's Days**" where worship will be followed by an opportunity to serve by working together on beautification projects at the church and needed assistance at the home of members and friends in need in the community. As we are all involved in caring for the facility we utilize to do ministry and helping out people in our community who are in need of a helping hand, the love of God will be evident and the ministry we offer will be better able to accomplish its purpose.
- The **Young People's Board** will be working to develop a ministry that consistently provides our youth with a place to hang out that is safe, exciting, and points young people to Christ. **GracePoint** will offer youth outreach events that our young people will look forward to inviting their friends to week after week and will offer a chance for our youth to exercise leadership in creating the environment, the program, and the creation of this important outreach.

## **Northeastern Ohio Synod Assembly**

Each year representatives from each congregation in the synod gather together for the Northeastern Ohio Synod Assembly. **This year's assembly will be held at the Knight Center in Akron, OH on June 16-17.** We need two delegates from our congregation to attend as voting members from our congregation. If you are interested in serving in this important capacity please contact the church office immediately so that arrangements can be made for your participation.

## **Grace Club for Everyone?**


