What to Watch: Cable for Canines

I'm afraid the show "Bad Dog!" will give Polo some very bad ideas. He's ornery enough as it is. "My Cat from Hell" I'm sure would drive him nuts. He hates cats as it is and one from hell might cause him to go over the edge. "Pit Bulls and Parolees"? No thanks! "Animal Cops"? Too depressing. "Infested!"? No way!

Whatever happened to all those cute puppies and adorable dogs? I guess the only visit to the Animal Planet for us is for the annual "Puppy Bowl" on Super Bowl Sunday. Much of the rest is too much like most other TV—loud, violent and crude.

Once "Animal Planet" became a "no show," we had to decide on a daily alternative. After sampling Nickelodeon, Cartoon Network and Disney Channel, we finally decided on PBS. The daily programming is not only highly suitable for kids, but doggy-friendly, too. Polo loves "Clifford the Big Red Dog" and "Martha Speaks" (I think, or am I projecting?). And, I imagine he is highly entertained by "Curious George" (My favorite!).

Yes, it may be a good idea to be careful about cable for canines, but it's far more important, even imperative, that we are careful about what our children are watching. Who knows what they may be learning. It almost goes without saying, that a lot of what's on TV is not conducive to character building.

Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

How do we use a paschal candle? Is it lighted only on Easter Sunday? Is there a standard protocol?

The paschal candle is often called the "Easter Candle." It is the "tall, big white candle" located at the front of our chancel area.

Traditionally, the paschal candle is the first candle lighted on Easter morning. It symbolizes Jesus' resurrection from the dead for our eternal life. Also traditionally, it is to be lighted before the beginning of every Easter season worship service.

According to the ELCA website: After the Day of Pentecost, the paschal candle is placed on its stand near the baptismal font as a visual reminder that in our baptism, we are crucified and resurrected with Christ. The candle is lighted at each celebration of Baptism, at which time small baptismal candles are lighted from it for presentation to the baptized or sponsor. This act is a visual reminder of the integral connection between Baptism and Easter.

For funerals, the paschal candle is lighted and placed in its stand at the head of the casket during the funeral rite. In a visual way, the paschal candle visually proclaims the message of Romans 6:3-5: In our Baptism we have already died and been raised with Christ."

Pantry or Paltry

There is only a one-letter difference between *pantry* and *paltry*.

Right now, if Old Mother Hubbard were to visit our cupboards, she'd notice they are in danger of becoming bare. Filling our pantry shelves and providing a viable Grocery Bag Ministry is an increasingly difficult challenge. The donations of food and cash have not been enough to meet a growing need.

On average, we have been giving out 120 bags of groceries each month. This is one bag of groceries per needy household once a month. It costs close to \$300 each week or close to \$1200 each month to keep this program going.


In 2010, Grace Lutheran received a \$5000 Economic Bridge Grant from Thrivent for Lutherans specifically designated for our Grocery Bag Ministry. We raised an additional \$4800 which Thrivent matched in addition to the original grant. All those funds have been used to support the pantry and are now depleted. Donations of food and cash since have not met our needs.

On April 30, there was only \$37.41 in our Outreach Fund to buy groceries. Pantry will soon be Paltry without a significant increase in donations.

Please pray for this important and needful ministry. Consider how you can support it so that our Grocery Bag Ministry may continue to be a witness to our love for our neighbors in Christ. Thank you.



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In April, we distributed 113 bags, and have already distributed 94 in May. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

concerned citizens from various churches and social service agencies in the county who have recognized the need to assist persons experiencing homelessness. The residents eat dinner at 6:00 each evening. All tableware is provided by the shelter, and they ask that if we are just dropping the food off to bring it in disposable pans.

PERSONAL CARE KITS AND SCHOOL KITS

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Personal Care Kits

1 light weight bath towel (dark color) 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file **School Kits**

- 4 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11"; do not include loose leaf paper
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 "long
 - 5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons, 5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.

If you would like to provide any of the items used in these kits please drop them off at the church office and we will assemble them.
