Paul Bunyan and Me

Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Romans 12:12

Timberrr! Again.

Wouldn't you know it? Another tree fell just feet from where I was sitting. This time the tree (or at least a large part of one) fell not at my home but in the church parking lot next to Luther Hall. This is now the third Dover tree to meet such a fate while I was close to the crash.

As you may recall, I lost a large tree last year that fell across Crater Avenue taking down powerlines and then rested in my yard for months. That was the tree with the iron pipe going up through its center that stymied several tree cutters. Finally, one tree chopper devised a plan to carve around the pipe and haul the remains away. It wasn't cheap!

What you may not know is that shortly after I moved to Dover, there was a large dying maple at the corner of E. 13th and Crater languishing near the fire hydrant. It fell across Crater during an early morning winter storm and blocked the street. City crews were there within an hour clearing the street and hauling wood before the day's school buses travelled by carrying students to their destinations. That cost me nothing except a few lost hours of sleep.

Then on Sunday, May 26, between worship services, a brief but powerful storm brought a halt to any plans for an outdoor worship service. It also brought down about half a tree onto our parking lot. And of course, so it seemed, everybody blamed me. "I see you're at it again," someone commented. "What's with you and trees anyways?" asked another. I replied by noting that if anyone had a tree they wanted to get rid of, I'd be happy to stop by; walk around it a few times; and then wait for some wind. That should do it.

Paul Bunyan and his blue ox Babe quickly and efficiently cleared entire forests for acres of farmland by swinging a mighty axe. Quincy and I don't have an axe. We don't need one. We can fell trees just by being there. We can even do it in our sleep!

During the past few weeks, we have all borne witness to the robust and violent power of nature. High winds, heavy rains, flash flooding and tornadoes have wreaked havoc across our country and nearby. Our Buckeye neighbors in the Dayton area are recovering from late-night tornadoes that wielded destruction, injury and even death. It will require days to restore power and clear the rubble. It will take months, even years to rebuild, restore and recover from the physical loss and emotional trauma.

Yet, they are not alone. The God of hope is with them, just as we find God with us during our own days of suffering and loss. God is there, always there, to strengthen us; console us; and encourage us with His steadfast love. Even in the direct circumstances, when all others hang their heads in despair, we look to the Lord and lift our voices and rejoice in hope. Along with the Psalmist, we can pray:

Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise Him, my Help and my God. Amen. (Psalm 42:11) Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church

Since You Asked

Since You Asked ...

I recently heard Christopher Columbus has some rather peculiar ideas about the End of The World. Are you familiar with them?

"In 1492, Columbus sailed the oceans blue..." That much I remember. I am not at all familiar with his religious views other than that he was a faithful Roman Catholic and had high regard for Pope Alexander VI. Columbus presented his adventurous plan to the pontiff in letter, hoping to secure missionaries to accompany him on the journey. He wrote: "I trust that by God's help, I may spread the Holy Name and Gospel of Jesus Christ as widely as possible."


Little did I know that in 1501, Columbus wrote the *Book of Prophecies*. Here he predicted Christianity would spread over the entire globe; the Garden of Eden would be found; a Final Crusade would take back the Holy Land from the Muslims; and a Last World Emperor would be chosen. This Emperor would lead the Final Crusade to free Jerusalem so that Jesus could return there. Columbus had in mind King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella of Spain for this role.

From **The Handy Christianity Answer Book** by Stephen A. Werner, Ph.D. Detroit:

In the Form of a Man

The Hindu temple is built in the form of a man. The outer court raised on pillars and open on all sides is the human body, the inner court with its wide spaces is the human mind, the shrine room is the human soul. Man moves within himself into himself and there finds the presence of God.

The Muslim mosque, too, is built in the form of a man. The central dome is man's head and the minarets are his hands upraised in prayer. Man comes to God through an act of adoration and submission.



The Buddhist dogoba, too, is built in the form of a man. Its figure is that of a man in the posture of meditation: legs crossed the body erect, and the head held straight and unmoving. The approach to reality is by way of inner withdrawal from the world.

The Christian church, too, is built in the form of a man, a man stretched out upon a cross. And this has made all the difference. The church does not ask its followers to find their way, or to discover truth within. The church says one man, Jesus of Nazareth is that way, is the truth. He is life. We put our faith in him knowing God comes to us and remains with us in Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In April, we distributed 110 bags, and have already distributed 95 in May. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. **Grocery size**

paper bags are also needed.
