Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

What did Jesus and his disciples do day by day during Holy Week? I remember seeing a poster with this information on it when I was in Sunday School as a youth, but I've forgotten much of it.

Here is the Holy Week timeline according to the Gospels.

Palm Sunday: Jesus makes a triumphal entry into Jerusalem with a great crowd waving palms and shouting "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord."

Monday: Jesus cleanses the Temple and declares, "My Father's house is a house of prayer; but you have made it a den of thieves."

Tuesday: Jesus spends the day teaching. He tells several parables; foretells the destruction of Jerusalem and his return in glory; and scolds the Sadducees for their denying God's power of resurrection.

Wednesday: This day is often called "Spy Wednesday" for it is the day Judas Iscariot conspired to hand over Jesus. Jesus spent the day in Bethany with Mary, Martha and Lazarus and rested.

Maundy Thursday: Jesus eats the Last Supper with his disciples and institutes the sacrament of Holy Communion.

Good Friday: Jesus is put on trial and condemned to die by crucifixion. Jesus dies on the cross for the forgiveness of all our sins.

Saturday: The dead body of Jesus lies in the tomb. His soul descends into Hell. (John 5:25, Ephesians 4:8)

Easter Sunday: Jesus is raised from the dead. He lives so that we, too, might live forever with him.



Holy Week is a time of deep spiritual reflection. It is also a time of that carries us through a full range of emotions and feelings. We begin by experiencing the thrills of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, and then find ourselves walking with our Savior on the lonely, sad and anguished road to Calvary. The despairing darkness of Good Friday turns to joyous light On Easter Sunday as we celebrate the glory of Jesus' resurrection and the powerful, life-giving blessings of his eternal love and grace.

Join us as we journey through Holy Week to rejoice and re-live the wonders of Easter. Sunday services are offered at 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. and include Holy Communion. Weekday services begin at 6:45 p.m. The Gallery Choir, under the direction of Roberta Myers, will offer special music at all services.

March 24: Palm Sunday: Children's Chorus sing at 10:30 a.m.

March 28: Maundy Thursday: At the Crossroads presenter: Oscar Romero; Holy Communion

March 29: Good Friday: At the Crosscoads presenter: St. Andrew

March 31: Easter Sunday: Easter Breakfast provided by Grace Youth at 9:15 a.m.





Though Jaclyn is not making the trip this year, she is helping her nursing colleagues reach their goal of over "6000 pills" for the Dominican people in dire need of medical attention.

Donation baskets for medications will be located in the church narthex February 24-March 24. Medications requested include children and adult pain relief [ibuprofen (Motrin), acetaminophen (Tylenol), 81mg aspirin], multivitamins, antacids (Pepcid, Zantac, Prilosec, Tums, etc.), cough medicines, and antifungal, hydrocortisone and triple antibiotic creams.

Please donate medicines in their original, unopened packaging. They should not expire before 1/01/14.

Jaclyn is a "life member" of Grace. She has been a three-time recipient of the Hammerstrom Scholarship for those pursuing medical or engineering careers. Jaclyn is the daughter of Mike and Christine Sergent of Dover.

GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In January, we distributed 149 bags, and have already distributed 95 in February. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

We at Grace have volunteered to provide one meal per month — the 4th Sunday of each month volunteers need and to provide the meal and to deliver it to the Friends of the of Tuscarawas **HOMELESS** Homeless County which is a group of



concerned citizens from various churches and social service agencies in the county who have recognized the need assist persons to experiencing homelessness. The residents eat dinner at 6:00 each evening. All tableware is provided by the shelter, and they ask that if we are just dropping the food off to bring it in disposable pans.

If you are unable to deliver your portion of the meal, please contact someone else who has signed up to deliver food.

Let's continue to work together as the body of Christ and serve our brothers and sisters in need.

PERSONAL CARE KITS AND **SCHOOL KITS**

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Personal Care Kits

1 light weight bath towel (dark color) 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file **School Kits**

- 4 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11"; do not include loose leaf paper
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 "long
 - 5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons, 5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.

If you would like to provide any of the items used in these kits please drop them off at the church office and we will assemble them.
