Since You Asked

Since You Asked...

Pastor, during this year's Lenten series, you told some stories from Jesus' childhood telling how he made flying birds out of mud and turned mean boys into goats. Were these stories products of your imagination or are they real stories from some other source?

I've been said to have a fertile imagination, but I did not invent these stories. The story about the Jesus making real, live flying birds out of mud comes from the **Infancy Gospel** of St. Thomas which is not a true gospel or written by St. Thomas. The legend of Jesus turning annoying neighborhood boys into goats (and back to boys again after a gentle reprimand from his mother Mary) is found in the **Arabic Infancy Narratives**, a compendium of stories of Jesus' youth in Nazareth. Other similar sources include the **Pseudo-Gospel of Matthew**, the **Infancy Gospel of James** and, surprisingly enough, the **Qur'an**. None of these writings are included in the **Holy Scriptures** because they were deemed either unreliable or false. Only St. Matthew and St. Luke give us any true, reliable and Spirit-inspired stories of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem and Nazareth childhood.

Cross Country: Walking with Jesus to Calvary

Our Lenten theme this year is: *Cross Country: Walking with Jesus to Calvary*. Each Wednesday at 6:45 **p.m**., a travel guide or an historical visitor will take us on a tour of a place where Jesus walked on his journey to the Cross. These guest presenters will share how each site shares an important vantage point in understanding Jesus and his great, saving love for us. Our Cross Country walk began in Bethlehem on Ash Wednesday and will lead us to Calvary by Good Friday.

Wednesday Evening services are preceded by a Soup and Sandwich Supper in Luther Hall at 5:30 p.m.

Caring for God's House and Tending to Our Father's Business

Grace Planning Council and Property Ministries Board have completed several projects and are working on several more to improve our worship, learning and working environment to the glory of God.

Sanctuary and narthex lighting has been replaced with new LED lighting. The lighting in the narthex, baptistery area and chancel is dimmable. Sanctuary ceiling lighting is still a work in progress.

The Fellowship Hall stage curtain including rigging will be replaced by April 9 in time for a Dover Library

children's theater production. We look forward to using the stage for a variety of upcoming programs and activities.

Planning Council approved **renovations to the kitchen in Luther Hall**. This will include new countertops, backsplash and a kitchen sink.

Planning Council approved the purchase of **new Xerox copier**. The previous one was over 7 years old and had printed close to one million copies.

Pipe organ repairs and restoration is being pursued. Our situation is currently being assessed by two reputable companies with recommendations and estimates forthcoming soon. Preliminary tuning and repairs will be completed before Palm Sunday.

Property Board has approved the **repainting of the sanctuary** and has approved a bid from Murray Slabaugh Painters to complete the project. No date for the project has been set at this time. The project should take two weeks, during which time; the congregation will worship in Fellowship Hall. (Good thing we have our stage back and now with a new curtain!)





GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In January, we distributed 155 bags, and have already distributed 110 in February. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.
