# When the Roll Is Called Up Yonder

Rejoice that your names are written in heaven. Luke 10:20

If there were such a thing, my father would be rolling over in his grave. He'd probably be spinning!

I just bought a new car. A foreign car. A Mazda CX-5.

My Dad had strongly instructed me and my siblings to never, ever buy a foreign car. It was a matter of economics. It was job security.

My father was a steelworker employed by *Jones and Laughlin Specialty Steel* in Louisville. His plant produced the chrome (Chrome bumpers, remember them?) and stainless steel that went into the construction of thousands of American-made cars every year. Few, if any foreign automakers purchased his steel. Thus, buying American kept him working.

I really hate to disappoint him, but once I test drove the CX-5, I was in "automotive love." All the research I did on the vehicle only exacerbated my feelings. It's a dream machine! Zoom! Zoom!

The thing is, not one part was made or assembled in the Good Ole USA. It's a bonafide all-Japanese product.

Interestingly, Mazda has its headquarters and manufacturing center in Hiroshima, Japan. It's the same city that was utterly destroyed by atomic bombs at the end of World War II. Like the mythological Phoenix, Hiroshima has risen from the ashes to be a major industrial and commercial center. What was left in ruins as dead and gone is now alive and thriving. It gives thought to the idea of resurrection.

As we enter and journey through this somber Lenten Season, we need to remember and look forward to the light awaiting us at the end of the trail. It is Jesus, the Light of the World. It is the light of our Resurrected Lord.

"I am the Light of the World," Jesus tells us. "I the Resurrection and the Life," he says. And on Easter, we celebrate the glorious Light that rose from the dank, darkness of the grave. We rejoice in the Life that vanquished death and decay once and for all. We exalt and proclaim the Light and Life of Jesus and his sure promises of eternal salvation.

We need not worry or fret over "rolling graves." Instead, we can rejoice in the great "roll calling." When the roll is called upon yonder; when our names are announced from the Lamb's Book of Life, we'll be there! My father will be there! You and I will be there! We'll all be there! There, forever in the light and life of God's eternal grace. Amen.

# Prayer Journey to the Cross Lept 2020

Wednesdays March 4-April 1 at 6:45 p.m. Maundy Thursday (April 9) and Good Friday (April 10) at 6:45 p.m.

Did you know there are at least 650 prayers in the Bible? Of course, the most famous and most precious is our Lord's Prayer recorded in Matthew 6:9-13.

Prayer is an important and integral part of our life with God. Jesus Christ encouraged us to pray often as a way of strengthening our relationship with God. He reminded us to keep the communication channels open and active with praise, thanksgiving, pleas and petitions; to express our joy and our sorrows; to avail ourselves to God's love, comfort and peace.

Of course, Jesus himself prayed fervently and often. The Gospels record at least twenty-eight instances when Jesus set himself apart from the crowds and his disciples to pray. Jesus' most ardent prayer was in the Garden of Gethsemane where his talk with God the Father concluded with the words, "Not my will, but Thy will be done." And, most remarkably, in all the humiliation and agony of the cross, Jesus prayed—prayed for us.

During Wednesdays in Lent and continuing through Holy Week, we will hear again and learn from some of the outstanding, life-affirming prayers found in Scripture.



# Worship the Lord in the Beauty of His Holiness



#### GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In January we distributed 125 bags, and have already distributed 90 in February. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. **Grocery size** paper bags are also needed.


