### Celebration Time!

May always tends to be a month of celebration. The school year is ending and there are parties and proms, field trips, and graduation ceremonies to attend. Add to that Mother's Day and Memorial Day celebrations and the month really starts to fill up. We will also be celebrating two more baptisms on Mother's Day this year and we'll celebrate Confirmation with five young people and their families on May 31st when we remember the birthday of the church on Pentecost Sunday. We will also be recognizing our High School graduates at the beginning of our services on May 31st. That's a whole lot of celebrating!

All this additional celebrating got me thinking about how we live together in the church. We in the church have reason to celebrate at all times and in all places. We have cause for joy in all circumstances. All too often the church and Christians are seen as solemn, dreary, and lacking in the joy and celebration categories. Caricatures of Christians who are ultra-conservative requiring children to go to bed hours before sunset and never eat sugar, like Ned Flanders of TV's Simpson's cartoon, contribute to this crazy notion that Christians somehow don't know how to enjoy life.

Quite to the contrary, Jesus himself was often chastised by the religious leaders of his day for "eating and drinking with sinners" and "for not requiring his disciples to fast." Jesus' first miracle involved turning water into wine so that the wedding celebration could continue. Jesus promised to bring "abundant life" and offers a yoke that is easy and a burden that is light.

I pray that you will take time to celebrate the goodness of God in each and every day. We all know that there are plenty of challenges that face us as individuals, as a congregation, and throughout our nation and world, and at times it seems a bit overwhelming. Still, even on those days when the pressures and demands of the world and our lives seem incredibly large; we as Christians can take confidence in the fact that our God is even bigger still. Our God is bigger than our fear, bigger than our challenges, bigger than our enemies, our God is bigger than death, our God is bigger than life and He invites you to live in His abundance. Now that is a real reason to celebrate! Let us live in the abundance of the Risen Lord, Jesus Christ and know that in Him there is hope, joy, and reason to celebrate each and every day we live in His name!

1 John 4:7–21 John 15:1–8


May 17 - What a Friend we have in Jesus




