## Updates

### “HEALTH KITS FOR HAITI”

During Lent we worked on gathering together items to make up health kits, first aid kits, as well as collecting soap to be sent to Haiti. The Lenten meal free will offerings were also passed along to Lutheran Disaster Response in Ohio to help pay shipping costs for the kits that were collected throughout the state of Ohio. The following is a summary of the offerings:

6 First Aid Kits — 10 Health Kits — 55 bars of soap and \$266 from the Lenten meal free will offerings. Prior to the Lenten effort we received \$595.50 for Haiti relief that was passed on to the ELCA.



As the saying goes, Haiti is “no longer on the radar screen” of the general public. That is the way it happens when there is a natural disaster. The harsh reality for the people of Haiti; as well as for the people of Chili who experienced an earthquake shortly after the one in Haiti; as well as for the people in our own nation who have suffered the devastation of flooding after a hard winter is that recovery and rebuilding takes years, not weeks or months. Hopefully, we will remember the people of Haiti, Chili and the flooded areas in the U.S. in our prayers and in our sharing of dollars for many, many months and even years to come.

**Grace Endowment Fund was established to help fund Christian endeavors within our congregation, community, and the world. The trustees meet four times per year to gift most of the earnings from the Endowment. Gifts in the past have included funding for missionary work, disaster aid for Katrina and the tsunami, the purchase of two AEDs for the Red Cross AED program, plus many more. This year gifts will exceed \$40,000.**

Requisitions must be in good order and turned into the church office two weeks prior to the trustee meetings.**





## HEALTH KITS AND LAYETTES

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Health Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

### **Health Kits**

- 1 hand towel (dark color)
- 1 wash cloth (dark color), 1 bath size bar of soap
- 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file
- 1 wide tooth comb, 6 band-aids

### **School Kits**

- Padded or spinal notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11" totaling 150-200 sheets; do not include loose leaf paper
- 1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 " long
- 6 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- 12 sheets of construction paper in assorted colors
- 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons




If you are unable to deliver your portion of the meal, please contact someone else who has signed up to deliver food.
