#### Who's Buried in Grant's Tomb?

[The angel] said to them, "Do not be afraid; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here.

Look! There is the place they laid him..." Mark 16:6

The Great Pyramids are famous because they contain the mummified bodies of ancient Egyptian kings, queens and pharaohs.

The splendiferous Taj Mahal in India is a major attraction, not only for its beauty, but also because it holds the body and tells the story of a queen who was greatly loved and adored by her husband.

Westminster Abbey in London is renowned because in it lays the bodies of English nobility, national heroes and acclaimed authors and artists.

Arlington National Cemetery and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Washington, D.C. are revered as the final resting place of brave soldiers and outstanding Americans.

In nearby Canton, thousands climb hundreds of steps to reach McKinley Monument and pay tribute to an entombed president.

#### The garden tomb of Jesus is famous because it is empty!

Though Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James and Joseph and the other women expected the garden tomb to hold the body of their beloved Jesus, they were the first to learn otherwise and hear the glorious Easter news. "He has been raised! He is not here! Look! **The tomb is empty!**"

Peter could not believe it! He clearly doubted the women. So he rushed to the tomb, and without hesitation, ran inside. He saw for himself. **It is empty**!

Throughout May and into June, we celebrate Easter and the promise of the empty tomb. Jesus lives so that we will live forever. "I am the resurrection and the life," Jesus declared. "Whosoever believes in me shall never die."

Though we celebrate the **empty tomb**, these are not days of emptiness. Not at all! Jesus lives to give us each and all lives full and overflowing with his grace. "I have come that you may have life, and have it more abundantly," Jesus said.

As children of the resurrection we are promised a life filled-up with God's steadfast love, his peace that passes all human understanding, and his unspeakable joy. # Since You Asked...

I really enjoyed the *Hot Chicken Salad* served at the Women of the ELCA cluster luncheon. Several of us are hoping to get the recipe. Can you help us with this?

This was a wonderful event! Grace Lutheran hosted close to ninety women on April 12. In addition to devotions, a Bible Study led by Deaconess Judy Hoshek and a business meeting, Grace offered its finest hospitality and provided a delicious lunch. Many there requested the recipe for the *Hot Chicken Salad* entrée.

There are several variations on this dish. This is my favorite. Enjoy!

3 c. chicken breast, cooked and diced

2 c. celery, sliced

½ c. slivered almonds, toasted

½ c. sliced water chestnuts

½ c. pimento

1 c. Miracle Whip

½ c. sour cream

3 T. lemon juice

2-3 T. finely grated onion

½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. ground pepper

1 c. cheddar or Colby cheese, shredded

½-1 c. crushed potato chips

Mix chicken, celery, toasted almonds, water chestnuts and pimento. In separate bowl, combine Miracle Whip, sour cream, lemon juice, onion, salt, pepper and ½ cup cheese. Mix with chicken mixture. Adjust seasoning to taste.

Pour into buttered/greased 9x13 baking dish. Top with crushed chips and remaining cheese.

Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Serves 8-12.

# **Beatitude Attitudes**

Spring 2011 Bible Study May 4-June 8 Wednesdays at 6:45-8:00 p.m. Luther Hall

The Beatitudes (Matthew 5:1-12) are Jesus' introduction to his Sermon on the Mount and his public teaching ministry. The words establish Jesus' basic ethical principles for discipleship and everyday Christian living.

The Beatitudes are written in two "stanzas." The first stanza identifies persons in great need of God's love and grace. The second stanza names those God calls to minister to our neighbors in need. All of us, at some time or another, have found ourselves in both groups.

Though the Beatitudes are comprised of only a few verses in Scripture, they are rich with meaning, significance and application. As we explore these words of Jesus, we can expect a closer look at our lives; a deeper understanding of those around us; and growing appreciation of how God works for us and through us. By God's grace, we can develop **Beatitude Attitudes** to God's glory and the benefit of our neighbors in Christ.

The Youth Ministries Board, under the direction of Jimm Morris, is in the initial stages of developing a job description for a proposed Coordinator of Youth and Family Ministries. ### **GROCERY BAG MINISTRY**

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In March, we distributed 71 bags, and have already distributed 45 in April. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.
