"What did you do on your vacation?" was the often posed question after I returned from my Easter break. "I got tools!" would have to suffice as my most productive reply.

I had taken some time off with all sorts of great plans. I had a list of projects around the house I wanted to get done. I needed to sand and repaint my outside entry way and door. I did take the sander out of the box! I even read the instructions! But, that's about it.

I got tools, but they haven't been used. Maybe someday...

In his first letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul reminds us of our God-given tools—talents, skills, abilities and aptitudes—which we can put readily and helpfully put to work to the glory of God and for the benefit of our neighbors in Christ. St. Paul invites us and God encourages us to take our tools out of the box; read the instructions (Biblical guidance); turn on the power; and get to work. Before you know it, there's another job begun and completed in God's grace (Galatians 1:6).

On May 6, the congregation will be voting on new bylaws to our Constitution. (See the article on page 4 and the additional information on the table in the narthex.) As you review the ministry boards' Mission Statements and strategies, I invite you to consider what tools you may have to advance the ministries of our congregation. How can you put them to use? How can you encourage others to use their tools, too?

I got tools! You got tools! All God's children got tools! Now, let's put them to use. Amen. #### Since You Asked...

Since You Asked...

I learned in Sunday School that Jesus originated the *Golden Rule*. Is this true? I've heard other religions have their versions, too. If Jesus didn't invent it, who did?

The *Golden Rule* is part of Jesus' *Sermon on the Mount*. It is recorded in Mathew 7:12, **"In everything do to others as you would have them do to you…"** (NRSV) Here Jesus is expressing in his own words the universal ethic of neighborly love. It is a truth shared by most cultures, religions and traditions. The rule has also been called the *Ethic of Reciprocity*.

The exact origin of the rule is unknown. The beginnings of this virtuous teaching can be found long before Jesus in the Babylonian Hammurabi Code (1780 BC) and in the Egyptian laws of the Middle Kingdom (2040-1650 BC).

In addition to its Christian expression by Jesus, other religions have their own particular versions. These include, but are not limited to:

Buddhism: "Hurt not others in ways that you yourself would find hurtful."

Hinduism: "Do not do to others what would cause pain if done to you."

**Confucianism:** "Surely it is the maxim of loving-kindness: Do not do to others what you would not have them do to you."

Islam: "Not one of you is a believer until you wish for others what you wish for yourself."

**Baha'i Faith:** "Lay not on any soul a load that you would not wish to be laid upon you, and desire not for anyone the things you would not desire for yourself."




#### GERANIUMS FOR MOTHER'S DAY, MAY 13, 2012

#### **GROCERY BAG MINISTRY**

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In March, we distributed 88 bags, and have already distributed 93 in April. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

#### **Personal Care Kits**

1 light weight bath towel (dark color) 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file School Kits

4 - 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11"; do not include loose leaf paper

1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx.  $2 \frac{1}{2}$  "long"

5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons,

5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.


