## Read Any Good Books Lately?

#### All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work. II Timothy 3:16-17

The literary and publishing world is all abuzz about the publication of Dan Brown's new book, **Inferno**. It is sure to be a blockbuster selling millions of copies. It is also likely to raise all sorts of theological and historical questions.

I'm not sure I'm ready for it.

I recall all the questions raised from his earlier sensational, popular and record-breaking novel, **The Da Vinci Code.** Remember that? I sure do.

I wish I had a dollar for every time someone asked me, "So, do you think Jesus was married?" Or, "Could it be possible that Jesus and Mary Magdalene had children? Could a remnant of their children's offspring be walking among us today?"

The short, sweet and best answer is "No. No. Certainly no." **The DaVinci Code** is fiction, I remind them, not a PBS documentary. It is based on ancient myths, legends, hearsay and wild speculation. Do you remember all the hubbub a few months back about the discovery of an ancient text purporting to support Jesus and Mary Magdalene's marital relationship. It turned out to be a hoax—another fiction.

Now we have the **Inferno** about to hit i-pods, i-pads and bookstores. I can almost hear the questions. "Are there nine circles of Hell?" "What about purgatory?" "Are some parts of heaven more sublime that others?" My brain is already hurting.

First, gentle reader, **Inferno** is not based on any verifiable data or credible testimony. It is fiction based on other fiction. The novel's main source is Dante's **The Divine Comedy** which is divided into three parts: *Inferno* (Hell), *Purgatorio* and *Paradiso* (Heaven). Dante's work is a fantasy not fact.

**Inferno** could be a fun summer read—perfect for a leisurely beach vacation. Actually, I am counting on it. Yes, dear friends, I've pre-ordered it. (The book, not the vacation)

Now, patient peruser, a few final comments:

- Jesus' only bride was, is and ever will be the Church. This heavenly imagery is found throughout St. John's **Revelation** and highlighted in **Ephesians** 5:25-27.
- As St. Peter reminds us, "For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been *eyewitnesses* of his majesty." **Scripture** is the sole, Spirit-inspired record of God's immutable truth past, present and future. Anything beyond Scripture is tainted by human conjecture and speculation. (II Peter 1:16-21)
- **The Holy Bible** makes for a wonderful faith-building and life-affirming ready anytime and anyplace. Its stories are more fascinating than Dan Brown's wildest imaginings and more powerful than Dante's greatest works.

If you have a summer reading list, include the **Holy Scriptures**—"the greatest story ever told." It's a great way to start, get through or end the day. The Bible is exciting and invigorating. It's also peaceful, calming and reassuring. It's everything a good read should be and more—so much more. Amen.

Since You Asked...

Twenty-five percent of our benevolence dollars now go to Lutheran World Relief (LWR). What is LWR and what does it do?

**Lutheran World Relief** is a pan-Lutheran service organization. Its mission statement reads: *Affirming God's love for all people,* we work with Lutherans and partners around the world to end poverty, injustice and human suffering.

**LWR** works with small-scale farmers access credit, learn about improved agricultural inputs and techniques, increase their yields, access markets and, ultimately, improve their incomes — so the people who feed the world don't have to worry about feeding their own families.

When disaster strikes, **LWR** is there, providing life-saving relief and support to those most in need. And LWR's response continues long after the headlines have faded, working with communities to rebuild their lives, recover their livelihoods, build resilience and pave the path to a brighter future.

**LWR** works with local partners to improve rural communities' access to water, digging wells and drilling boreholes, building and restoring irrigation systems, providing clean drinking water during emergencies, and training communities on sanitation practices and water management.

**LWR** works both to educate people about malaria and other diseases of poverty and to improve their economic situation so they are able to access health care services.

**LWR** educates and empowers marginalized people to raise their voices, advocate with their governments, and participate in the decision making processes that affect their lives.




There is so much we can learn from these seven letters. Which one looks like it could have been written to us? What can we learn from other congregations' historic experiences?

## **GROCERY BAG MINISTRY**

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In March, we distributed 121 bags, and have already distributed 87 in April. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

We at Grace have volunteered to provide one meal per month — the 4th Sunday of each month volunteers need and to provide the meal and to deliver it to the Friends of the of Tuscarawas **HOMELESS** Homeless County which is a group of



concerned citizens from various churches and social service agencies in the county who have recognized the need assist persons to experiencing homelessness. The residents eat dinner at 6:00 each evening. All tableware is provided by the shelter, and they ask that if we are just dropping the food off to bring it in disposable pans.

## PERSONAL CARE KITS AND SCHOOL KITS

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

#### **Personal Care Kits**

1 light weight bath towel (dark color) 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file School Kits

4 - 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11"; do not include loose leaf paper

1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 " long

5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons,

5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.




