# Name It and Claim It!

...with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which He has called you, what are the riches of His glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of His power for us who believe, according to the working of His great power. Ephesians 1:18-19

Recently, my Mother left me a voicemail asking me to phone her. It wasn't urgent, she said, but I should give her a call.

When I did, my Mother seemed excited to relay a bit of good news. It seems my Aunt Carol read my name in the newspaper in the Stark County Unclaimed Funds section. Indeed, my name was listed with my previous address in Louisville. And who knows, it could be a lot of money. Big bucks! Cha-ching-a-ling-a-ling! All I had to do is "name it and claim it"!

Sorry to say, it's not that easy.

In addition to submitting a completed claim form, I had to supply a copy of my driver's license and proof of my Social Security number. This I can understand. But then, there were the questions. Was this an open estate, a closed one or neither? What additional documentation would I need to include in order to validate my claim?

All this was beyond my skill set. I needed some helpful advice and direction. So I consulted our top local property and realty specialist who responded quickly and clearly. (*Thank you, Nathan Vaughan!*) Now I knew what to do. I just had to do it.

Through this process, I was led to a government website that could offer me more information on my claim. I found the amount of my unclaimed funds. **It's a whopping \$99.14!** Certainly, not the big bucks I hoped for. Cha-ching without the ching. Not such a great claim after all.

It is certainly nowhere near the great claim we have in Christ Jesus. In Ephesians, chapter 1, St. Paul reminds us of our great inheritance according to the riches of God's grace. We lay claim to this inheritance, all the goodness of creation and all the glories of heaven through our faith in God's beloved Son, Jesus Christ. We can lay claim because God first claims us as His children. As St. John reminds us in his first letter, "See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know Him. Beloved, we are God's children now..." (I John 3:1-2)

There's no form to fill out. No need to summon an attorney. It's all ours through faith and faith alone. It's that simple. That clear. That sure. Name it and claim it in Jesus name! Amen.

Since You Asked...

# Since You Asked...

At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit is represented by tongues of fire. At Jesus baptism, the Holy Spirit is seen as a dove descending and resting on our Lord. What other symbols for the Holy spirit do we find in Scriptures?

Thank you for that timely question. You are right! In Acts 2, the Holy Spirit comes to the gathered disciples as tongues of **fire**. Some believe the Holy Spirit was the fire that did not consume when Moses encountered the "burning bush."

And, all the Gospel accounts of Jesus' baptism, the Holy Spirit descends upon him in the form of a **dove**. This is the most familiar symbol of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit is also depicted as **wind** and the "**breath of God**." In Genesis 1, the Holy Spirit hovers over creation in the form of a great wind. In Acts 2, the Holy Spirit is the great wind that fills the room that his precedes the tongues of fire.

Jesus speaks of the Holy Spirit as "**living waters**." In John 7:37-38, Jesus says, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them." By this he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive. We first encounter these "living waters" at baptism when the Holy spirit creates faith in our hearts.



#### **GROCERY BAG MINISTRY**

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In Mar., we distributed 110 bags, and have already distributed 101 in April. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.




