Who knew that while shopping up and down the aisles at Buehler's you could take in a history lesson. Well, you can. That's where I learned all about Johnny Baconseed.

According to the historians at Purina PetCare, Johnny Baconseed is an American hero to our canine companions. On the back side of a bag of Applewood Smoked Flavor Beggin' Strips you are invited to:

As he ventured from field to field, house to house, he shared the Gospel of Jesus with those making their way in the wilderness. Along with apple seeds, Johnny planted seeds of faith. Their fruitful harvest is still with us today.

This year, as we gather around our Thanksgiving tables, we will thank God for a plentiful harvest and daily bread. Turkey, dressing, mashed potatoes and gravy, corn casserole (!), homemade rolls and pumpkin pie are all signs of God's providential love and tender care. This tasty fare should not only fill our bellies, but also our hearts with praise. Truly, God has richly blessed us with the beauty and bounty of the earth.

May we also remember to thank God for the pioneers of our faith and for all who have planted the seeds of God's grace in our lives. Some of them may be sitting right close to you.

As for a warm Bacon pie... Well, Polo would be mighty thankful for big piece of that, but it's not on this year's menu. A nice puppy pot pie made from the leftovers will have to do. Amen.



The Christian Faith and Life Committee is requesting donations to help support the Advent Workshop. We are in need of the following supplies:



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In September, we distributed 107 bags, and have already distributed 107 in October. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.

concerned citizens from various churches and social service agencies in the county who have recognized the need to assist persons experiencing homelessness. The residents eat dinner at 6:00 each evening. All tableware is provided by the shelter, and they ask that if we are just dropping the food off to bring it in disposable pans.

PERSONAL CARE KITS AND SCHOOL KITS

Two of our Lutheran World Relief Projects are making Personal Care Kits and School Kits. These kits provide much needed supplies to many people around the world. Items that go into each kit are:

Personal Care Kits

1 light weight bath towel (dark color) 2 bath size bars of soap, 1 wide tooth comb 1 adult size toothbrush, 1 nail clipper with file

School Kits

4 - 70 sheet notebooks of ruled paper approx. 8 1/2" X 11"; do not include loose leaf paper

1 blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

1 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other

1 pencil sharpener, 1 eraser approx. 2 1/2 "long

5 new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band

1 box of 16 or 24 crayons, 5 black or blue ball point pens - no gel ink; secure with a rubber band.


