Since You Asked...


Since You Asked...

I always think of Gabriel as the Christmas Angel. Does he appear elsewhere in Scripture?

There's good reason to think of Gabriel as the "Christmas Angel." It is he who appears to Zechariah telling him that he and his wife Elizabeth will soon be the parents of John the Baptist. Their son will be the one who "prepares the way of the Lord" and proclaims "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world."

Gabriel then announces to the Virgin Mary the astounding Good News that she will conceive by the power of the Holy Spirit and bear the Son of God and the Savior of the world. It happens just as Gabriel said in Bethlehem where "she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn." The angels proclaimed that infant boy to be the "Savior who Christ the Lord."

The only other place Gabriel appears is in the Hebrew Scriptures in the book of Daniel. In chapter 8, Gabriel appears to Daniel to interpret and help him understand a mysterious vision. Gabriel tells Daniel it is a vision of the end times and that he is to preserve it for future generations. Gabriel appears to Daniel again in chapter 9 and reminds him he is beloved of God and blesses him with more wisdom and understanding.

Thank you for helping our neighbors in need. The children will warmly appreciate your gifts.




Cheeeze Time

Kyle Nelson's Hammerstrom Scholarship Essay -



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In Sept., we distributed 137 bags, and have already distributed 125 in October. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.


