Since You Asked

Since You Asked...

When Pope Francis visited America, I watched a few of his Masses. I was wondering why he waved incense three times and rang a little bell during Holy Communion. Can you tell me what this all about?

The incense represents the prayers of the priest and the people ascending up into heaven to the Throne of God where Jesus intercedes for us. This symbol has Biblical precedent in Psalm 141:2 where David writes, "May my prayers rise up before you like incense." In Revelation 8:4, St. John notes, "The smoke of the incense, together with the prayers of God's people, went up before God..." The three-fold waving of the incense represents our prayers going up before Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

As for the tinkling of the bells, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) refers to bell ringing in instruction No. 150: "A little before the consecration, when appropriate, a server rings a bell **as a signal to the faithful.** According to local custom, the server also rings the bell as the priest shows the host and then the chalice."

The birth of the custom of a signal bell at the consecration, probably during the 13th century, had more to do with the recitation of the canon in a low voice than to the language of the Mass as such. *It may also have been inspired by changes in church architecture in which the people were more physically separated from the altar by the choir -- and in some cases a significant number of faithful were impeded from seeing the altar during Mass.*

A draft, preliminary budget will be made available to the congregation on the table on the narthex beginning November 1. Planning Council will meet November 10 to approve the final document provided to the congregation at its annual meeting.

The congregation will also approve a new member to our Grace Endowment Board. Current member President Ron Stahl has completed two terms and is constitutionally ineligible to serve another term. We truly appreciate his fine leadership and helpful contributions to the board.

Hammerstrom Scholarship Essays


Jana Keller



GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In September, we distributed 155 bags, and have already distributed 165+ in October. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size paper bags are also needed.

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.




