What Time Is It?

Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift! II Corinthians 9:15

As many of you know, I have the privilege of offering the invocation before Dover City Council meetings in January and October. It just so happens when I was present for both October 2018 meetings, one of the topics for information and discussion was the wonderfully renown Dover High School Clocktower.

There seems to be some quasi-plan to remove, refurbish and temporarily store this venerable landmark. Then once the high school is built, "it will probably be on a cement base and put at one of the entranceways," says the superintendent. The actual details and costs are not yet clearly known.

Neither, apparently, is the clocktower itself.

As I listened to the discussion, I couldn't remember ever seeing a clocktower at the high school. Surely something as important as this would be both manifest and memorable. How had I missed it?

It seems there were many who shared my bewilderment. When I asked several people, who had lived in Dover all their lives; who attended and graduated from Dover schools; who sent their children and grandchildren there; none were able to identify or place this historical timepiece. Finally, a participant in my Thursday noon Bible Study claimed familiarity and described its appearance and location. Still, we were left wondering if we'd ever seen it or not?

Then, at last I saw it for myself in a newspaper photo. Yes, friends, there really is a clocktower at Dover High School!

The reason we may have never noticed it is that the clocktower is clockless. It does not have a clock and it never has. What's more, the tower is not a tower but an architectural embellishment near the roofline of the 1915 Fifth Street wing entrance. It gives a whole new meaning to the word "timeless."

So, tell me, how do you describe a clockless, not-a-tower clocktower to inquiring minds? They may still want to know. It's almost indescribable and inexplicable. It's tough, but possible. A picture or a walk along West Fifth Street would help a lot.

It sure is a lot easier than describing God's gift of grace. God's grace is truly indescribable!

We can modify it. Amazing Grace! Boundless grace! All-sufficient grace! But to describe grace accurately, fully and truly is a tremendous, insurmountable challenge.

St. Paul seems to say, "Don't even try." Grace is God's free gift of love and mercy that only God can completely comprehend. It is a gift only God can give. Knowing grace, appreciating grace, living grace is a daily act of faith.

As we express our deep gratitude to God this Thanksgiving season, let us all remember to thank God for His indescribable gift of grace. It is our hope and our salvation. It is the greatest gift of all.

Since You Asked

Since You Asked...

Hi, Pastor! I'll bet you'll be making your wonderful corn casserole for Thanksgiving Dinner. It's a great recipe. Do you by any chance have a good cranberry salad recipe for us?

Yep! I'll be making my corn casserole again this year! My family insists, and they really enjoy it.

I usually do not make the cranberry salad. I have been delegating this tasty task to one of my nieces. If I do make it, here's my favorite.

Ingredients

Cranberry Jell-O

- * 2 (3 oz.) pkgs. cherry Jell-O (or raspberry or cranberry)
- * 1 1/2 cups boiling water
- * 1 (20 oz.) can crushed pineapple (do not drain)

- * 1 (8 oz.) pkg. cream cheese, softened
- * 1/2 cup powdered sugar

- * 1 can whole cranberry sauce
- * 1 cup chopped pecans, divided
- * 3/4 cup cranberry or apple juice
- * 1 cup sour cream


Instructions

Cranberry Jell-o

- 1. Add both packets of Jell-O to the boiling water in a large bowl, stirring until completely dissolved.
- 2. Stir in the crushed pineapple (juice and all) and whole cranberry sauce, using the back of the stirring spoon to break up any chunks of cranberry sauce a bit against the side of the bowl.
- 3. Add in 3/4 cup of the chopped pecans and the cranberry or apple juice and stir to combine, then carefully pour into a 9x13-inch glass dish and refrigerate until set, about 2 hours.

Topping

- 1. In a medium bowl, beat the cream cheese on high speed with an electric mixer until smooth.
- 2. Add the powdered sugar and sour cream and mix well until completely combined, then spread over the top of the set Jell-O.





GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In September, we distributed 104 bags, and have already distributed 110 in October. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. Grocery size

paper bags are also needed.
