THE CHALLENGE OF CHANGE

Our four year old grandson, Joseph, is going to a different pre-school this year. Instead of the in-home setting where he was one of four or five children, he is now at a church where there is some ten to fifteen children. It is a big change. It means getting acquainted with new children and teachers. It also means that he is no longer spending time with William, his best friend at last year's preschool. Joseph misses William. But, when you are four years old, change such as Joseph is experiencing is manageable and not necessarily overwhelming. The teachers may be new, but he is now attending pre-school at the church he attends on Sunday morning. There may be new children to get to know, but they are not all strangers since at least one or two were children that Joseph got to know in Sunday School and Vacation Bible School. But, he still misses William.

What about other changes in life? When you are 14, or 34, or 69, or 80? Are they as manageable for us older folk as they are for four year old Joseph? The departure of Pastor Lewis and his family plus actions taken at the national assembly of the ELCA means change. And just as Joseph is working on overcoming some of his concerns about a new pre-school, so we, as a congregation, have some changes to also work on and deal with in our life together as people of God. There are some of us who are saddened by the departure of Pastor Jim, Dana, and the kids. But there are also some who probably considered that to be a good thing, both for the Lewis family and for Grace congregation. That is almost always the case when a pastor accepts a new call and leaves the congregation he or she has been serving. There are some of us who agreed with the actions taken at the national assembly concerning sexuality issues. And there are some of us who very much disagree. Once again, that is almost always the case when controversial issues and decisions are made by people no matter what the setting may be.

CHANGE IS CHALLENGING – for any age. And, yes some change is more challenging than others. But what is common, no matter what the age or setting or issue is our deciding how we will respond to the change, or how we will react to the change. To respond in a thoughtful manner that respects and recognizes those who may not agree with us as sisters and brothers in Christ is not easy. But can we do anything less if we take seriously our being made one in Christ? If we simply react and allow our fears, anger, or resentments rule, we risk losing sight of what Holy Spirit has done and continues to do in our individual lives as well as our life together as the body of Christ, even when we see change in different ways.

I am confident that Joseph will figure out how to handle the change that has taken place in his life this year. I am also confident that we, as Grace Lutheran Church, are capable of diligently working together in the process of calling a new pastor as well as coming to terms with actions taken at the ELCA national assembly. But that will require conversation, not lectures. That will require much listening and patience. That will require prayer. No, we will not all agree. But agreement is not really the goal. The goal is proclaiming in words and deeds, in spite of our different opinions or understandings, the Good News of a Lord who has overcome death on the cross and provided for the world the gifts of Hope, Grace, Mercy, Forgiveness, Love, and Peace.

A WORD FROM OUR BISHOP

The season of Pentecost is sometimes called "ordinary time" – endless, even monotonous, Sundays after Pentecost without a festival. I would be willing to wager that since the churchwide assembly life in your parish has been anything but ordinary. Many of our people and congregations are wrestling with the actions taken on ministry policies. A discussion about allowing "congregations that choose to do so to recognize, support and hold publicly accountable lifelong, monogamous, same-gender relationships" and that the ELCA find "a way for people in such publicly accountable, lifelong, monogamous, same-gender relationships to serve as rostered leaders of this church" which seemed distant and theoretical is now reality. The anger, grief, confusion and yes, joy and hope, our people feel are real. And I suspect, a lot of us are feeling disoriented. The ELCA that existed before the churchwide assembly is not the ELCA that exists today.

For many, myself included, this causes real discomfort. I do not like discomfort. I want to do something that makes the discomfort go away. I do not want to wait. I want to do something now.

The e-mail, conversations, and letters I have received since the churchwide assembly often reflect the discomfort our people are feeling. They also reflect the desire to do something. Withholding mission support, even leaving the ELCA are cited. I have heard from you that parishioners are already withholding offerings and threatening to leave the congregation. This must be extremely painful. The rostered leader in a congregation serves as the local, human face of the ELCA. Though some of our people are angry with what they perceive to be the faceless bureaucracy of the ELCA, their own pastor or associate in ministry is the one who is going to hear about it.

In our people's desire to do something about this situation they do not see that they are placing the rostered leader in a very difficult position. In the letter of call and the rite of installation rostered leaders agree and commit themselves to increase the support given by the congregation to the work of the whole church. They also promise to carry out their duties in harmony with the constitutions of the ELCA — constitutions that specifically pledge financial support and participation in the life and work of the ELCA (C6.03b). If a congregation leaves the ELCA the rostered person can no longer serve that congregation. These unintended consequences — forcing rostered leaders to act contrary to vows they have made or, in the case of leaving the ELCA, effecting the termination of the rostered leader's call — may not have occurred to members of our congregations.

I do not deny that the discomfort is acute, discomfort caused by one's deeply held, scripturally based convictions being at variance with the actions taken at the churchwide assembly, but we need to model restraint and encourage one another to walk back from the edge. Can our congregations be places that model civil, respectful disagreement or will they be places infected

with the polarization of our culture? Can our congregations be safe places where people speak their convictions, but speak in humility and love, or will they be places infected with the winnertakes-all attitude of our culture? The church is better than that and we are the church. I pray that we find a way to stay engaged with each other.






