In God, whose word I praise, in God I trust; I am not afraid; what can mere mortals do to me? Psalm 56:4

A tornado heading your way would make you run for cover. There would be no thinking twice. You'd be in danger! You'd be frightened!

Think about it. What is so scary or intimidating about Quakers? They are a very peace-loving and peacemaking Christian sect. They are traditionally quiet and pious. What are they going to do? Meditate you off the field?

Don't even let me get started about those ferocious Buckeyes! Who'd feel threatened by a bunch of nuts running up and down the field? Unless you're Goliath and David puts one in his slingshot, you have nothing to worry about.

I'll concede, there may be someone somewhere who is afraid of buckeyes or Scotties or even Oregon Ducks. Perhaps someone has endured the horrible nightmare of William Penn pushing and holding him under in a big vat of hot, steaming oatmeal, hence the fear of Quakers. It could happen, I guess.

The thing is, all of us come with our own set of fears and phobias? Afraid of the dark? Thunder and lightning? Snakes? Speaking in public? Death?

Whatever our fear, the Psalmist reminds us we can trust God to be with us to strengthen and protect us. God is always there to embrace his with His love and enfold us in His tender care.

Jesus' promise, "Lo, I am with you always" comforts us in the dark, through life's storms and when we close our eyes in eternal rest. "Peace. Be still," echoes throughout the ages from the Sea of Galilee to where we are today.

What? Me afraid? With God at our side, all fears diminish. Peace surrounds us and grace abounds. Amen.



Since You Asked...



Since You Asked...

With Reformation Day being celebrated this month, can you give us a little background on Luther's 95 Theses?


In 1514, in addition to his teaching duties at Wittenburg University, Luther began to serve as a priest for Wittenburg's Castle Church, and people flocked to hear God's Word preached like never before. He spoke passionately about Christ's role as the only mediator between God and man, and that by grace and not through works, are men justified and forgiven of sin. Salvation, Luther now felt with all assurance, was God's free gift. It didn't take long for his radical ideas to get noticed. Not only did these revelations of God's truth change Luther's life, they would forever change the direction of church history.

During this time Luther learned of the Catholic Church's unbiblical practice of selling indulgences. The Pope, according to his discretion from the "treasury of merits from the saints," sold religious merits in exchange for building funds. Those who purchased these indulgence documents were promised a reduced punishment for their sins, for the sins of departed loved ones, and in some cases, total forgiveness from all sin. Luther publicly objected to this dishonest practice and abuse of church power.

On October 31, 1517 Luther nailed his famous 95-Thesis to the University's bulletin board—the Castle Church door, formally challenging church leaders on the practice of selling indulgences and outlining the biblical doctrine of justification by grace alone. This act of nailing his Thesis to the church door has become a defining moment in Christian history, symbolic of the birth of the Protestant Reformation.

Luther's vocal criticisms of the church were seen as a threat to papal authority, and he was warned by the Cardinals of Rome to recant his position. But Luther refused to change his stand unless someone could point him to scriptural evidence for any other attitude.

Grace Welcomes Sharman Harston

Sharman Hartson has been hired and begun her duties as our Coordinator of Youth and Family Ministries following a most favorable interview by the screening committee, a recommendation from the Personnel Board and approval by the Executive Committee of Planning Council. She was introduced to our young people and their families during Rally Day activities on Sunday, September 11.

Sharman comes to us from Springfield, Tennessee. She has served as a youth minister, an associate minister, interim minister and museum curator. She now lives in Dover. Sharman's sister along with some nieces and nephews reside in nearby Sugarcreek. Her mother lives in Mansfield where Sharman grew up.

This first weeks, Sharman was been busy meeting with parents, church leaders and others in order to get a good perspective on our needs and opportunities and to begin planning upcoming faith-based social programs and service projects. How did I get to Grace Lutheran Church? It all started just over a year ago. I lived in Springfield, Tennessee for over 24 years, and I realized the time was right to move back to Ohio. I sold my house, said good-bye to many good friends, and packed the U-Haul truck for one more long drive north to beautiful Ohio. I was born and raised in Mansfield, Ohio, where my mother still lives. My sister and her family live in the Sugarcreek area. I have been traveling to Tuscarawas County for many, many years, and was familiar with the area: the mall, restaurants, and attractions. But, I had never seen Dover Park! I like to walk (about 2-3 miles each day), and the beauty and serenity of the park provided an unexpected gift!

A friend of the family told me about the position at Grace Lutheran Church, and I felt like my ministry experiences would be a good fit for the position. My ministry has included: directing church camps, over-sight of women's fellowship groups and programing, interim ministry, mission trips, Christian Education and Youth pastor, and curator at Disciples of Christ Historical Society for over eight years. Most of these ministries were in or near Nashville, but I traveled extensively throughout Tennessee.

I was married to Ollie Hartson for over 25 years. He died in 2005. I have three step-sons and six grand-children, and they are scattered from California to Indiana to Ohio. I have a little dog, Casey, a 13 year old Dachshund. She has adjusted well to her new home in Dover. I enjoy reading, playing golf, walking, cooking, and playing cards. My greatest joy in the past two months has been spending more time with my three great nieces and nephew, ages 1 to 5. There will be another "great" little person in December.

I like exploring the area. I found a pottery shop in Holmes County, re-discovered the historic town of Zoar, visited Warther Museum, played golf in Sugarcreek, and shopped at Belding Village Mall. I saw the Dover band march through downtown and at the Band Preview! I like watching football, baseball, and golf. I have always been a Cleveland Browns and Indians fan.







The youth are asking for donations of individual serving size of water to be used for the Chicken Barbecue. Donations may be dropped off at the church office weekdays 9-3.





GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In August, we distributed 88 bags, and have already distributed 79 in September. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list.


