# The Most Important Book You've Never Heard Of

How did the first Christians practice their faith? How did they live and worship? How did they function as a community of believers? How are their faith practices impacting the way we worship and serve today? **The Didache** gives us invaluable information and insight to these questions and more.

**The Didache** simply means "The Teaching" and is often called "The Teaching of the Twelve Apostles." It is one of the earliest Christian documents, earlier than most writing of the New Testament. It is often regarded as the first catechism of the church, providing direction for worship, church policy, community and personal behavior. The small, concise book highlights sayings of Jesus common to the Gospels of Matthew and Luke and shows how they are to be understood and practiced by his followers as "the way of life."

During our Fall 2016 Bible Study, we will explore "The Teaching" and discover its timeless truths and note how what was taught among the earliest Christians is still be practiced today. The sessions will meet in Luther Hall on Wednesday evenings at 6:45 starting September 28 and continuing through October 26. A copy of **The Didache** will be offered to all participants. Bring your Bibles as we connect "The Teaching of the Twelve Apostles" to those of Jesus.

My brothers and sisters in Christ of Grace Lutheran Church,

It was 34 years ago that when I met Esther that she asked me what I did for a living. I told her I was in sales. "Oh thank goodness she said, you can be anything but a pastor!" My Mom always wanted me to marry a pastor and I swore I never would! Although others had encouraged me to pursue the ministry, I felt it was "safe" to follow a path that my brothers and father had. A few years later on the way home from Church she asked me why I was refusing to follow Christ's call on my life. We decided then, that I would work toward finishing my undergrad degree while supporting our family.

When I was a teenager, the members of the Church I grew up in, encouraged me to serve on my first call committee and Church council. Esther and I married there and moved to Ashtabula and quickly got involved serving Messiah Lutheran on Council, teaching Sunday school and ultimately the call committee that called Pastor Liz Eaton. This congregation continued to recognize my gifts for ministry where I also served as a lay assisting minister and I continued to think serving the Church in these other capacities was enough! We moved here to Dover and quickly began serving on council and Sunday school and two call committees. I began taking night courses to complete my undergrad on my own and then moved to Columbus to work full time while entering seminary. It has been a long road, but not at all as long as the one our own Lord walked and his disciples.





# GROCERY BAG MINISTRY

Thanks to all who have volunteered to be packers for the Grocery Bag Ministry this year.

Donations to the Food Pantry have increased in response to a greater need for our food bags. In August, we distributed 149 bags, and have already distributed 134 in September. We are seeing a greater demand for this outreach program. Monetary and food donations are very much appreciated.

What goes into a bag to feed the hungry? The basic food items are: peanut butter, canned meat, vegetables, fruit, cereal, soup, macaroni & cheese, canned white potatoes, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles. We also pack a roll of toilet paper and a bar of soap when available.

We welcome all packaged/canned donations. We will pack any kind of soup, fruit, vegetable, soap or toilet paper that is donated, as well as extra items not on the list. <u>Grocery size</u> <u>paper bags are also needed.</u>

Thank you to all who bring food in for the grocery bags that are filled each month. Look in the Sunday bulletins to see which items are most urgently needed.
